

#### **Dear Parents,**

On Monday, we had the day off school in honor of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. I hope you and your family took the time to celebrate Dr. King's life and his example. We talk a great deal about 21st Century educating at NDA. There are many facets of 21st Century learning, one being the education of students to work effectively in a diverse and multicultural society. In order to be effective leaders and to promote justice for everyone in our society, students need to understand and appreciate the world's wide range of people and cultures.

On Friday, we will focus on respecting life for all, from conception to natural death. We will have a prayer service with the NDA community on Friday morning to pray for the protection of all human life. We will also pray for those members of our school community who will be traveling to the March for Life in Washington D.C.

In accordance with the recently updated *Diocesan COVID-19 Return to School Requirements 2021-22 School Year*, beginning next Monday, January 24, we may return to a recommended mask policy when the following requirements are met:

- we have 5 or less cases of COVID-19 at NDA, and
- cases are declining

As you can see below in our weekly COVID-19 update, we have had 15 new reported cases of members of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week at NDA and we have had 4 additional members of our community who are currently in quarantine due to a reported exposure to COVID-19. **THEREFORE, masks will continue to be required at NDA from January 20-26.** We will continue to monitor and report weekly cases of COVID-19 at NDA on Wednesdays in the Panda Press Weekly. The mask protocol for the 7 days following (Thursday - Wednesday) will be announced each week based on the number of new cases we have each week. As stated above, if we have 5 or less cases and cases are declining, we will return to a recommended





## FROM THE SCHOOL NURSES IMPORTANT MASK AND BOOSTER INFORMATION

Dear Parents,

You have probably heard in the news or from your pediatrician that the FDA and CDC now recommend **booster shots** of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine for children ages 12 through 15 in addition to recommending boosters for those 16 and older. The reason that teens should get a booster shot is because while the vaccines currently available have been providing strong protection against serious illness, a booster dose "reminds" your immune system of what the COVID-19 virus looks like. It also protects you against new strains of the virus. Booster shots also help decrease the chance you could spread COVID-19 to someone else.

**Please note:** students who received the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine should get a booster at least 6 months after the second dose. You can view the most up-to-date information on COVID-19 vaccine booster shots on the CDC's website <u>HERE</u>. Please keep our office informed of information regarding your daughter receiving a COVID-19 vaccine and/or booster shot.

**Masks** have also been a hot topic in the news this week. You can read a summary of the latest masking changes on the CDC website <u>HERE</u>. Basically the CDC reminds us that any mask is better than no mask and they continue to recommend that people wear the most protective mask they can that fits well and that they will wear consistently. NDA has provided KN95 masks to faculty and staff to provide them with the best level of protection during the spread of the Omicron variant.

Also, every home in the U.S. is eligible to order 4 **free at-home COVID-19 tests**. Orders will usually ship in 7-12 days. We encourage you to take full advantage of this free offer for your convenience and personal home use. You can order your free at-home COVID-19 tests <u>HERE</u>.




### IT'S SHOW TIME! CSW TALENT SHOW

### KENTUCKY ED CHOICE

Last Thursday, EdChoice Kentucky joined Senator Ralph Alvarado and Representative Josh Calloway in Frankfort as they announced new legislation to expand school choice options in Kentucky.

The new bills would help more families take part in Kentucky's expansive educational choice program. They would allow students in every county in the Commonwealth to use scholarship funds to cover tuition at a nonpublic school. The bills also increase the income eligibility, giving more families access to much-needed education dollars. And, if family demand exceed the current cap at \$25 million, the bills would automatically increase the ceiling so more families could move their students to the head of the class.




### GET YOUR TICKETS TODAY BUY TICKETS FOR THE HEROES & VILLAINS SHOWCASE
















#### SHOWING SUPPORT BASKETBALL PANDAS RALLY FOR ONE OF THEIR OWN

### SWIM SEASON AQUA PANDA NEWS

The Aqua Pandas have been very busy with practices and meets during the month of January. Freshmen Regionals are at the end of the month and Regionals are in early February. The team competed in two meets over the past week:

#### Tri-Meet with Lafayette HS and Lexington Catholic HS...

On Thursday 1/13, the swim team traveled to Asbury University after school to compete in a tri-meet vs. Lafayette HS and Lexington Catholic HS. These are two of the top teams not only in Lexington, but in the state. The team

came up short, losing to both teams, but there were many good swims. Elizabeth Smith (3rd in 500 freestyle) provided the lone top 3 finish in the individual events. Top 3 relays included Payton Hatfield, Smith, Sammie Poulos, and Mary Reynolds (3rd in 200 medley relay) and Hatfield, Andi Carothers, Smith, and Poulos (2nd in 400 freestyle relay). Overall, the team recorded "best times" in 20 individual events (of a possible 32) and for 8 relay splits.

#### **Rock The Block...**

On Saturday 1/15, the team traveled to the University of Louisville to compete in Rock The Block, hosted by Trinity HS. The team finished 9th out of the 20 teams competing. Top 16 finishers in the individual events included Sydney Dierig (6th in 1 meter diving), Sammie Poulos (14th in 50 butterfly), Mary Reynolds (9th in 1 meter diving), and Elizabeth Smith (5th in 100 individual medley). Top 16 relays were Payton Hatfield, Smith, Poulos, and Andi Carothers (8th in 200 medley relay); Megan McKeown, Sophia Helson, Abby Hay, and Annie Dierker (14th in 100 freestyle relay); Poulos, Smith, A. Carothers, and Hatfield (6th in 200 freestyle relay); and Grace Summe, Lindsey Carothers, Ali Wells, and Abby Otto (14th in 200 freestyle relay). Overall, the team recorded "best times" in 20 individual events (of a possible 28) and for 10 relay splits.

This weekend, the swim team travels to Union College in Barbourville, KY to compete in the SHDHS Winter Invite, hosted by St. Henry District HS. This meet features 17 high schools, mostly from Northern Kentucky, including top rivals Ryle, Dixie Heights, and St. Henry. Good luck AquaPandas!
