Parents, thank you for your continued support of our mission and please know I am grateful to partner with you in this important work!



# WEEKLY UPDATE

As of today, Wednesday, January 26, we have had 12 new reported cases of members of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week. We have had 3 additional members of our community who are currently in quarantine due to a reported exposure to COVID-19.

# FROM THE SCHOOL NURSES COVID-19 INFORMATION

Dear Parents,

In accordance with the recently updated <u>Diocesan COVID-19 Return to School Requirements 2021-22 School Year</u>, we are able to return to a recommended mask policy when the following requirements are met:

- we have 5 or less cases of COVID-19 at NDA, and
- cases are declining

As you can see above in our weekly COVID-19 update, we have had 12 new reported cases of members of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week at NDA and we have had 3 additional members of our community who are currently in quarantine due to a reported exposure to COVID-19. **THEREFORE, masks will continue to be required at NDA from January 27 - February 2.** 

We will continue to monitor and report weekly cases of COVID-19 at NDA on Wednesdays in the Panda Press Weekly. The mask protocol for the 7 days following (Thursday - Wednesday) will be announced each week based on the number of new cases we have each week. As stated above, if we have 5 or less cases and cases are declining, we will return to a recommended mask policy. We are hoping to get to 5 or less cases within the next two weeks. We truly appreciate your support following our COVID-19 protocols at NDA. Our success throughout these past two challenging years is a direct result of our community working together to keep each other safe and healthy.

Keep in mind, COVID-19 vaccines and boosters are our best defense against the virus, they lower our risk of getting and spreading the virus and help prevent serious illness and death. 


### GET YOUR TICKETS TODAY HEROES & VILLAINS SHOWCASE - SUNDAY TIME CHANGE!




### EARN COLLEGE CREDITS COLLEGE LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAMS (CLEP)

College Board - the same organization that administers high school Advanced Placement (AP) courses - ALSO administers College Level Examination Programs (CLEP), another way for high school students to earn college credits. CLEP offers 34 exams that cover introductory level college course material. 

# INCOMING FRESHMEN PRIORITY APPLICATION PERIOD

The NDA Freshman Priority Application period is from January 3, 2022 – February 11, 2022. If you have an 8th grade daughter who is interested in applying as an incoming freshman for the 2022-2023 school year, you can find our Application for Admission <u>HERE</u>.

Students who apply for admission during the Priority Application Period have a better chance of receiving seats in high-demand classes such as Art I and some foreign language classes. Students who apply during this period are included in a drawing for a free iPad or a \$500 tuition voucher. Incoming freshmen who are eligible for academic scholarships must apply for admission by the priority deadline in order to confirm receipt of their scholarship.
