SHOWCASING INNOVATION AND LEADERSHIP

NDA STUDENTS EARN TOP HONORS AT REGIONAL PITCH COMPETITION

Students from Notre Dame Academy's Entrepreneurship Club and Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) competed in a pitch competition hosted by Square One at St. Xavier High School, earning top awards for creativity, innovation, and real-world impact.

Junior Brooke Sweeney earned first place overall and a \$3,000 cash prize for her business, Oats Elevated, an overnight oats company focused on nutritious, convenient food options. Sweeney plans to use the prize money toward an incubator kitchen to expand her product offerings and scale production.

Students Lizzy Fite and Lauren Pence earned the "Creates the Most Buzz" award for their innovative sweatshirt design created for patients with cancer, diabetes, and Alzheimer's. Their design includes easy-access flaps for IVs and ports, an internal insulin pump holder, and a fully reversible style that eliminates confusion about how the garment is worn. Their project was recognized for its thoughtful design and user-centered approach.

Additional NDA teams also competed in the event. Audra Schneider, Olivia Eibel, and Lorna Knarr presented an idea for a microplastic boat filter aimed at reducing water pollution. Seniors Ava Boertlein, Lucy Siegert, and Riley Pope pitched a resume creator app designed to support students and young professionals as they prepare for the workforce.

A special thank you to Megan Zumbiel, who attended the competition and supported NDA students throughout the event.

These experiences highlight Notre Dame Academy's commitment to developing young women who are confident leaders in innovation, entrepreneurship, and STEM - equipped to identify challenges, think creatively, and design solutions that serve others.

CREATIVITY AND REAL-WORLD APPLICATION

COMMERCIAL ART & DESIGN STUDENTS BRING ORIGINAL APPAREL DESIGNS TO LIFE

Our Commercial Art & Design class midterm project challenged students to create an original shirt or sweatshirt design to be featured in the Bambootique. Students began by sketching their ideas in Procreate or Canva, then developed foundational skills in Adobe Illustrator to transform their sketches into vectors suitable for screen printing. On exam day, each student pitched their design to the class, and a favorite (designed by Stella Wise) was selected by student vote to be printed at Underground Sports.

On January 6, the class took a field trip to Underground Sports, where students toured the facility and learned about the screen-printing process—from translating a digital design to screen preparation and production, to watching the final designs printed on the press.

The day continued at the American Sign Museum with a design- and branding-focused tour highlighting the history of iconic brands such as Holiday Inn and McDonald's. Students concluded the visit with a hands-on activity in which they were given a business prompt and tasked with designing a logo and slogan that reflected the era in which the business was established.

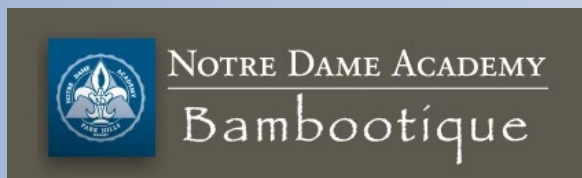

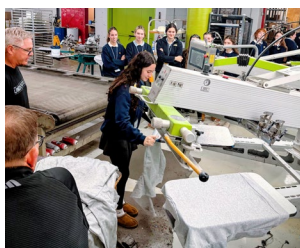
