Northern Kentucky Athletic Conference (NKAC) Championships... This past weekend, the AquaPandas competed in the NKAC meet at the Kenton County Aquatic Center (Scott HS), finishing 2nd (out of 9 teams) in Division 1. The team competed well and lots of girls won their heat despite having slower seed times. Top 8 individual finishers included:

Track and Field -

The Track and Field team is in their Indoor Season and they're working hard. Upwards of 40-50 girls have been practicing during this non-mandatory time. The team had a fun team building joint practice with Covington Catholic's team which allowed the girls to be tested in a 30 meter sprint, broad jump, 1600 meter and a mixed 4x400 relay with Covington Catholic. The team has their first official Indoor Meet at Cedarville University this Saturday February 3. This will be their first opportunity to qualify for the Class AAA Indoor State Championship on March 2. The top 24 competitors in the State in each event qualify for the State Meet.



Archery -

The Archery Pandas shot a season high 3073 which included 144 tens at the Summit View Academy Tournament this past weekend. A special congratulations to Ava Boertlein who scored 288 and was 1st Overall High School Girl Archer. Rounding out our top five were Sarah Beckham at 267, Reagan Carman at 265, Lea Youtsey at 262 and Savannah Bien at 261. Three other Pandas shot over 250: Jade Wachs at 257, Morgan Russell at 256 and Lauren Agriesti at 250. Six Pandas shot their season best scores: Sarah Beckham, Savannah Bien, Ava Boertlein, Kara Dugan and Ivy Mullins. Also Lauren Agriesti, Katie Ahern and Reagan Carman tied their season best scores. 
PANDAS EMPOWERED


