At NDA, we are blessed with a rich legacy of academic excellence established by the SNDs 116 years ago. We would like to thank the Sisters for their dedication to Catholic education at Notre Dame Academy and for treating our students to ice cream on Monday in honor of Catholic Schools Week. Tonight is our annual NDA/CCH charity volleyball game benefitting the Emergency Shelter of Northern Kentucky (ESNKY). This is a wonderful way for our community to make a difference during this special week.

I would like to thank our faculty and staff for their strong commitment to Catholic education. In addition to dedicating their time and talent to educating our students at NDA, **79% of our faculty and staff have generously donated to our 2021-22 Annual Fund**. I am happy to report that our community acted promptly and effectively keeping in mind that our priority is the safety and well being of our students, faculty and staff.



As of today, Wednesday, February 2, we have had 2 new reported cases of members of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week. We have had 0 additional members of our community who are currently in quarantine due to a reported exposure to COVID-19.

COVID-19 INFORMATION

Dear Parents,

As you can see above in our weekly COVID-19 update, we have only had 2 new reported cases of a members of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week at NDA and we have had 0 additional members of our community who are currently in quarantine due to a reported exposure to COVID-19.

Due to the low number of reported COVID cases this week and the decline we have seen in positive cases over the last few weeks, we will move to a RECOMMENDED MASK POLICY today at the end of the school day. Masks are recommended at school and extra-curricular events but not required.

We will stay the course and continue to monitor and report weekly cases of COVID-19 at NDA on Wednesdays in the Panda Press Weekly. We have used our weekly data to guide us in developing our COVID-19 policies and protocols for nearly two years and that practice has served us well. Our hope is that we will continue to see a low incidence of positive cases.

Please note that members of our community who are returning to campus after testing positive for COVID-19 will still be required to wear a mask as per the following guidelines:

Positive COVID-19 Test (With symptoms)

- · Stay home and isolate for 10 days from the date symptoms began
- Isolation may be shortened if symptoms fully resolve. You may resume activities after day 5 on the first day without symptoms (Must be fever free for 24 hours)
- · Wear a mask for 10 days since the start of symptoms

Positive COVID-19 Test (No symptoms)

- · Stay home and isolate for 5 days from the date of your test
- · Wear a mask for an additional 5 days

Please keep in mind, COVID-19 vaccines and boosters are our best defense against the virus. You can view the most up-to-date information on COVID-19 vaccine booster shots on the CDC's website <u>HERE</u>. Please keep our office information regarding your daughter receiving a COVID-19 vaccine and/or booster shot.

KENTUCKY SCHOOL CHOICE BILLS

ED CHOICE

House Bill 305 and Senate Bill 50 have been filed and would expand educational choice for Kentucky families. Please call or email your State Representative and Senator today and ask them to support and co-sponsor these bills. You can call 1-800-372-7181 and the operator will leave a message for your State Representative and Senator based on your home address.

Education Opportunity Accounts are privately funded by citizens and businesses who donate to non-profit Account Granting Organizations (AGOs). The AGOs then use the donations to award needs-based funding to eligible families. Funding can be tailored to a student's specific needs and used for K-12 non-public school tuition and fees, online learning programs, tutoring services, therapy programs, transportation to and from school, and more. HB 305 and SB 50 would expand this program to every county in Kentucky and would increase the size of the program so that more families can apply.


PANDAVERSITY CELEBRATES BLACK HISTORY MONTH

INCOMING FRESHMEN

PRIORITY APPLICATION PERIOD

The NDA Freshman Priority Application period is from January 3, 2022 – February 11, 2022.

All-girls' schools offer enormous value to their students, value that cannot be duplicated in other school settings. At an all-girls' school, young women learn self-confidence, leadership skills, and they excel in the areas of reading, writing, mathematics and science.

If you have an 8th grade daughter who is interested in applying as an incoming freshman for the 2022-2023 school year, you can find our Application for Admission HERE.

Students who apply for admission during the Priority Appli-

cation Period have a better chance of receiving seats in high-demand classes such as Art I and some foreign language classes.

Students who apply during this period are included in a drawing for a free iPad credit or a \$500 tuition voucher. Incoming freshmen who are eligible for academic scholarships must apply for admission by the priority deadline in order to confirm receipt of their scholarship.
