HONOR ROLL

Notre Dame Academy proudly recognizes students who achieve Exceptional Marks and earn placement on the Honor Roll each semester. These honors are calculated using the semester weighted scholastic mark and reflect both academic achievement and consistent performance.

Students earning First Honors achieve an average weighted scholastic mark of 95 or higher, have no weighted scholastic mark (M1 or M2) below 90, and have no incomplete grades.

Students earning Second Honors achieve an average weighted scholastic mark of 85 or higher, have no weighted scholastic mark (M1 or M2) below 80, and have no incomplete grades.

A HISTORIC MILESTONE FOR NOTRE DAME ACADEMY

THE 1906 IDEAL INNOVATION SPACE IS DEDICATED AND BLESSED

Notre Dame Academy marked a joyful and historic milestone with the dedication and blessing of the 1906 IDEAL Innovation Space, a transformational learning environment that reflects the school's long-standing leadership in educational innovation, technology and STEM education.

The celebration brought together students, faculty, staff, alumnae, parents, board members and the Sisters of Notre Dame to officially open a space designed to prepare young women for leadership in a rapidly changing world. Rooted in the academy's Catholic mission and inspired by its founding in 1906, the IDEAL Innovation Space stands as a bridge between tradition and transformation.

IDEAL, an acronym for Innovation, Discovery, Education and Learning, was intentionally designed to support hands-on, student-centered learning. Featuring flexible collaboration areas, integrated technology and adaptable learning zones, the space encourages creativity, critical thinking, problem-solving and interdisciplinary exploration.

For generations, Notre Dame Academy has been a leader in academic excellence, particularly in STEM disciplines. The IDEAL Innovation Space builds on that legacy, providing students with opportunities to engage in design thinking, applied technology and collaborative projects that mirror real-world challenges while remaining grounded in ethics, faith and service.

During the ceremony, President Lauren Hitron emphasized that the space represents more than a physical renovation.

"This evening is about who we are and who we are called to form," Hitron said. "At Notre Dame Academy, we educate young women to be faith-filled leaders, confident problem-solvers and thoughtful innovators prepared to shape the future with courage and purpose."

Principal Lisa Timmerding shared that the vision for IDEAL was rooted in a guiding question: how to design learning experiences that prepare students not just for college, but for lives of leadership, service and impact.

"Our commitment to academic excellence is inseparable from our Catholic identity," Timmerding said. "Here, innovation is guided by values, discovery is rooted in ethics and leadership is grounded in service."

The dedication included a blessing of the space by NDA Chaplain Fr. Conor Kunath, asking that it become a place of discovery, collaboration and courage, and that all who learn there may be guided by wisdom, compassion and integrity.

Named in honor of Notre Dame Academy's founding year, the 1906 IDEAL Innovation Space reflects the pioneering spirit of the Sisters of Notre Dame, who embraced innovative approaches to education long before the term became commonplace. Their legacy continues today as NDA remains at the forefront of educational technology and STEM learning for young women.

Made possible through the generosity of donors and the collective support of the NDA community, the IDEAL Innovation Space is already coming to life as a hub of curiosity, creativity and collaboration. It will serve as a cornerstone for future-focused learning while reinforcing the values that have defined Notre Dame Academy for more than a century.

As NDA looks to the future, the opening of the IDEAL Innovation Space signals continued momentum and a deep commitment to forming confident, compassionate leaders ready to make a meaningful difference in the world.

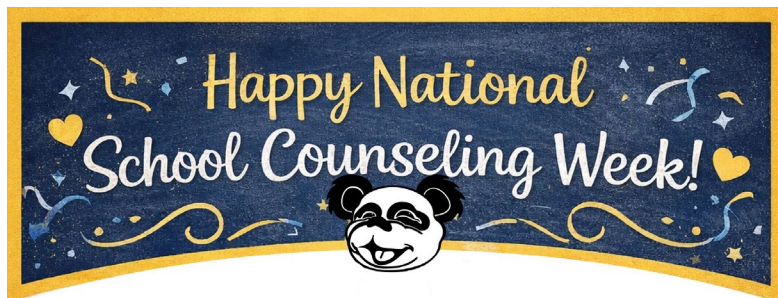
