I am confident that with your continued support and Mrs. Miller's leadership, NDA will continue to thrive and excel in the years to come.

In the meantime, I am pleased to share with you that the search for the next principal of NDA is already underway. Mrs. Miller will form a selection committee tasked with reviewing applications and conducting interviews with the goal of having a new principal in place by July 1, 2024. I have full confidence in the strength of our NDA community and our ability to find the ideal candidate to lead us into the future.

Once again, thank you for your support and encouragement throughout my time at NDA. I am grateful for the opportunity to have been part of such a wonderful community and I look forward to seeing all that Notre Dame Academy will accomplish in the years to come.

LATIN 2 ROMAN HOUSE PROJECT

DOMUS, DULCIS DOMUS!

The Latin 2 students recently completed their annual Roman house project. Students learn about Roman housing in Latin 1 and continue this study in Latin 2, ultimately designing their own floor plans and constructing their own Roman house models.



The project involves including all of the standard features and rooms to a wealthy Roman 'domus' (house) in their design, while also including a certain number of extra rooms and features and their own design aesthetic and creative twist to them, combining the ancient with the modern. They label everything in their houses in Latin. Students are able to use whatever material they wish to build their house models.

Over the years, Latin students have made houses out of Styrofoam, model clay, sugar cubes, Legos, wood, cardboard, popsicle sticks, and more. This year we had one student even attempt to bake a cookie house! While that tactic proved a bit too difficult in its execution, it was a great example of the creativity and hard work that students put into their projects each year. Students are also able to build virtual Roman houses in Minecraft and a few do so every year - not easy to encapsulate in pictures, but they are always incredibly neat to see.

While the majority of Romans actually lived in multi-story apartments, rather than large homes such as these, few apartments have survived, and none anywhere near as fully in-tact. There are many very well-preserved ruins of large Roman houses such as the ones students designed in Italy among the ruins of the ancient cities of Pompeii, Herculaneum, and Ostia still today, though, and we are able to learn a great deal from them. This project allows students to express their creativity, take part in hands-on learning, have fun working together in partners and groups building them with friends, and visualize better how the Romans lived.

HOST FAMILIES NEEDED


