

Dear Parents,

Last week after our Catholic Schools Week Mass, I took the opportunity to speak to our students about a recent experience I had attending the Sisters of Notre Dame Global Catholic Education Conference. The conference, *Cultivating a Culture of Encounter and Care*, focused on how Catholic education can promote the seven commitment areas that Pope Francis outlined in the *Global Compact on Education*. In this document, Pope Francis invites everyone who cares about education to sign a Global Pact, creating a worldwide change of mentality through education.

In the Global Compact on Education, the Pope shared seven areas or commitments to transform education:

- To make the human person the center of every educational program
- · To listen to the voices of children and young people
- · To encourage the full participation of girls and young women in education
- · To see in the family, the first and essential place of education
- · To educate and be educated on the need for acceptance of the most vulnerable and marginalized
- To find new ways of understanding economy, politics, growth, and progress that can truly stand at the service of the human person and,
- · To safeguard and cultivate our common home

I took a great deal away from this 3-day SND conference, especially the obvious parallels between Pope Francis' *Global Compact on Education* and the educational principles of the Sisters of Notre Dame. Attending this SND conference not only helped me rekindle my dedication to education but it also reaffirmed for me the work we are doing here at Notre Dame Academy. As you know, each school year we focus on one of the four educational principles as Sisters of Notre Dame. In doing so, we are preparing young women to be responsible servant leaders who fully participate in life as kind and compassionate global citizens.

We are blessed at NDA to be a Catholic high school grown in the tradition of the Sisters of Notre Dame.



COVID-19

As of today, Wednesday, February 9, we have had 2 new reported cases of members of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week. We have had 0 additional members of our community who are currently in quarantine due to a reported exposure to COVID-19.

COVID-19 INFORMATION

Dear Parents,

This week at NDA we are continuing to see fewer COVID cases than were reported since the start of 2022. This is reflective of what we are seeing in the community at large. Our hope is that we will continue to see a decline in the reported incidence of positive cases both at NDA and in our region.

Due to the low number of reported COVID cases this week and the decline we have seen in positive cases over the last few weeks, we will continue with a RECOMMENDED MASK POLICY at NDA. Masks are recommended at school and extra-curricular events but not required.

Our best advice for students and families is to get vaccinated and stay current on your vaccine booster shots. You can view the most up-to-date information on COVID-19 vaccine booster shots on the CDC's website here: https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/index.html. Please keep our office informed of information regarding your daughter receiving a COVID-19 vaccine and/or booster shot. Keep in mind the quarantine details of our Isolation and Quarantine Procedures at NDA:

Exposure to COVID-19 Home or Outside of School (Vaccinated*)

- · Continue school, work, or activities if symptom-free
- · Wear a mask for 10 days
- · If symptoms develop, isolate and get a COVID-19 test

Exposure to COVID-19 Home or Outside of School (Not vaccinated*)

- · Quarantine for 5 days
 - For a home exposure, the quarantine period begins when the COVID positive case can isolate from the household members or the positive case has recovered
- · May resume activities after five days if you have no symptoms
- · Wear a mask for an additional 5 days
- If symptoms develop, isolate and get a COVID-19 test


