Spanish 2 students also learned this week about Carnaval celebrations around the Spanish speaking world. We finished the lesson by making masks.










ROARING '20s



DIOCESAN SURVEY

WHAT'S IN YOUR HEART?

This Lent, your parish will be conducting a survey on discipleship called the Disciple Maker Index (DMI), and they need to hear from you! As part of the diocesan With One Heart initiative, the survey will ask you to reflect on your own spiritual growth and on your parish's efforts to help you become the best disciple you can be. The information gathered will be used to plan for the future so your parish can become a more faith-filled, vibrant community. The greater the participation, the more reliable the information will be for effective decision-making. The DMI will be accessible online from February 22 through March 27 and will take 10-15 minutes to complete (paper surveys are available for those who need them). All responses will be confidential; the parish will only receive information about the community as a whole. Results will be shared with the parish in late spring/early summer. AQUA PANDAS FINISH THIRD IN KHSAA STATE SWIMMING & DIVING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Notre Dame Academy followed up their Regional championship by finishing third in the KHSAA State Swimming & Diving Championships. Sacred Heart Academy from Louisville won their 11th straight title and Lexington Catholic edged the Aqua Pandas for State Runner-Up 202-196.

The diving competition was Thursday 2/16 and the swimming competition was Friday 2/17 with prelims in the morning and finals in the evening. Both events were contested at the University of Kentucky's Lancaster Aquatic Center.

Top 16 finishers in the individual events were:

- Sadie Hartig (2nd in 500 freestyle and 12th in 100 backstroke)
- Lainy Kruger (1st in 200 freestyle and 100 breaststroke)
- · Claire Monahan (13th in 200 freestyle and 5th in 500 freestyle)
- Riley Quinn (7th in 200 individual medley)
- Danaka Tucker (14th in 200 freestyle and 13th in 500 freestyle)
- · Olivia Wallace (12th in 200 freestyle and 15th in 500 freestyle)

Top 8 relays were:

- 200 medley relay (4th Sophie Anderson, Kruger, Quinn, and Hartig)
- 200 freestyle relay (4th Monahan, Wallace, Quinn, and Hartig)
- 400 freestyle relay (4th Monahan, Tucker, Wallace, and Kruger)

Lainy Kruger was named to the All-State team.

Other members of the State team included diver Brooke Hollenkamp and swimmers Andi Carothers, Marisa Kent, Sammie Poulos, and Peyton Quinn. Congratulations AquaPandas on a great season!
