Thank you for choosing Notre Dame Academy for your daughter's Catholic education.



SCHEDULING

This week the freshmen, sophomore and juniors were able to view the courses they were recommended for by their current teachers and choose their elective courses in Powerschool. They all received instructions and reminder emails. The ability to choose elective classes will end on Friday, February 25 at 5 p.m. After that, students can still make changes but they will need to contact a counselor to make that change. Here are some important dates to note:

Wednesday, March 2

Last day for students to submit <u>"Request to Change Recommenda-tion" form</u> to Counselors (this is if a student wants to take a class she was not recommend to take)

Friday, May 6

Last day for students to submit a course change (students can try to make a change the first two weeks of school after this deadline)

Friday, May 26

Last day to change an AP course (no change will be made in the first 2 weeks of school like other courses allow)







OPT OUT OPTION SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING



EARN COLLEGE CREDITS COLLEGE LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAMS (CLEP)


