


# PROMOTING MENTAL HEALTH HOPE WEEK INSPIRES AWARENESS AND CONNECTION

This past week, our Notre Dame Academy Community and Hope Squad celebrated Hope Week, a week dedicated to promoting mental health awareness, suicide prevention, and community connection.

Our week featured themed days and activities designed to reduce stigma surrounding mental health and suicide, spread kindness, and remind students that they are not alone. We celebrated activities such as “Hug Your Mind”, encouraging positive self-care, challenged students to “Clip Kindness”, sharing positive messages with others, and served “We’re Rooting For You” root beer floats at lunch to remind students that others care.

Students were able to dress down for \$3 and funds were donated to the Zero Suicide Mission at Chincinnati Children’s Hospital. NDA was able to raise a total of \$1,365.58 for Hope Squad and the Zero Suicide Mission. Through a multifaceted team approach, Cincinnati Children’s Zero Suicide Mission is equipping providers with new skills, conducting research and raising awareness in the community. If someone is struggling, connecting to treatment reduces suicide rates by providing essential mental health care, building resilience, fostering social support, and ensuring safe care transitions after crises. ## PROPOSED SCHOOL CHOICE LEGISLATION IN KENTUCKY

Below is a message recently shared by EdChoice Kentucky regarding House Bill 1, legislation connected to the Federal Scholarship Tax Credit program. As a school community committed to expanding educational opportunities for young women and families across the Commonwealth, we are sharing this update for your awareness and information.


Yesterday, the possibility of school choice becoming a reality in Kentucky took a giant step forward. Representative Kimberly Moser filed House Bill 1 ([HB 1](#)), which essentially compels the Commonwealth of Kentucky to opt in to the Federal Scholarship Tax Credit (“FSTC”) program for K-12 students. Unlike other tax credit programs, all K-12 students, whether in public or private schools, may participate, and the FSTC program is entirely funded by the Federal government and DOES NOT cost the Commonwealth of Kentucky anything. Perhaps equally important as the bill itself is its assignment as House Bill number 1, which signals the priority legislators place on passing it. Obviously, House Speaker David Osborne prioritizes giving Kentucky’s children the means to pursue the best educational opportunities for their circumstances.

We will keep you updated as the bill moves through the legislative process, and we encourage you to thank [Rep. Kimberly Moser](#) and [Speaker David Osborne](#) for their commitment to K-12 education in Kentucky.

Highlights include:



