Completed applications should be emailed to <u>workstudy@ndapandas.org</u>.

Financial aid applications are also now open and will remain open until April 15, 2023.

If you are in need of financial assistance OR are looking to do work study the application with FACTS must be completed before anything else. Financial assistance requests increase each year. We cannot stress enough the importance of getting your application in early. Late applications run the risk of financial aid funding being exhausted. If a family receives financial assistance, a family member is expected to have a work study job.





WHAT'S IN YOUR HEART?

This Lent, your parish will be conducting a survey on discipleship called the Disciple Maker Index (DMI), and they need to hear from you! As part of the diocesan With One Heart initiative, the survey will ask you to reflect on your own spiritual growth and on your parish's efforts to help you become the best disciple you can be. The information gathered will be used to plan for the future so your parish can become a more faith-filled, vibrant community. The greater the participation, the more reliable the information will be for effective decision-making. The DMI will be accessible online from February 22 through March 27 and will take 10-15 minutes to complete (paper surveys are available for those who need them). All responses will be confidential; the parish will only receive information about the community as a whole. Results will be shared with the parish in late spring/early summer. The rain and wind on Friday didn't extinguish the Archery Pandas sunny performance at the Beechwood Archery Tournament. The team shot a season high score of 3125 which included 99 tens, 129 nines and 81 eights - all of which are season highs. The team was led by Ava Boertlein at 284 (1st Overall Girl), Ellie Puglisi at 281 (6th overall girl) with a perfect 50 end, Sarah Beckham at 267, Lea Youtsey at 263 and Kate Slocum at 262. Five other archers shot 250+ - Morgan Russell at 257, Lucy Siegert at 254, Reagan Carman at 254, Emma Lange at 254 and Candace Stallmeyer at 252. Five Pandas shot season highs: Sarah Beckham by 13, Emma Lange by 4, Abbey Hollenkamp by 3, Kate Slocum by 1 and Ava Boertlein by 1.

The team would like to thank Vanessa Hinsdale, Archery Coach at Simon Kenton, for all of her help with tournament registrations throughout the season and for compiling scoring and results for the Panda Classic. We also thank Emily Baker, NASP Region 8 Coordinator as well as the many schools who hosted tournaments and made the season so much fun. 


