As we journey together through this holy season of Lent, we remember the importance of our identity as a Catholic high school. Our students have many opportunities not only during the Lenten season, but throughout the school year, to grow in their faith at NDA. Forming the young women of Notre Dame Academy to be servant leaders is an integral part their experience here. Teaching them the importance of putting their faith into action and their responsibility to develop their God-given gifts and to share those gifts with others are key components of an NDA education.

As you will also see in the news below, our students continue to work hard in both academics and co-curriculars at NDA. It is wonderful to see them so fully engaged once again. What you will also see is the common denominator in the majority of our success at NDA - collaboration. Our students, faculty and staff learned this lesson well these past two years and continue to work together to accomplish great things.




Mrs. Newton and the other presenters shared their experiences and advice, their secrets to success, and answered questions concerning their personal and professional lives.

Financial aid applications are also now open and will remain open until April 15, 2022.

If you are in need of financial assistance OR are looking to do work study the application with FACTS must be completed before anything else. Financial assistance requests increase each year. We cannot stress enough the importance of getting your application in early. Late applications run the risk of financial aid funding being exhausted. If a family receives financial assistance, a family member is expected to have a work study job.

GREAT SEASON! SWIM & DIVE WRAP-UP

The Notre Dame Academy Swim & Dive team recently ended their season, finishing 7th in the State Meet, tops among Northern Kentucky schools. The AquaPandas were led by junior Lainy Kruger who won two individual titles in the 200 freestyle (1:46.14) and 100 breaststroke (1:01.34), earning automatic All-American status and breaking school records in both events, and was selected to the All-State team. Freshman Sadie Hartig had two Top 8 individual finishes in the 200 freestyle (6th, 1:54.34) and 500 freestyle (3rd, 5:04.43). Junior Riley Quinn had a Top 16 individual finish in the 200 individual medley (10th, 2:10.01). Lainy, Sadie, and Riley were joined by junior Sophie Anderson for two Top 8 relay finishes in the 200 medley relay (6th, 1:49.37) and 400 freestyle relay (8th, 3:37.53).

Previously, the AquaPandas finished 3rd in the Region 7 Championships. Lainy broke the regional record in the 200 freestyle (1:47.84) and was voted Outstanding Female Swimmer of the meet. Sadie and Riley joined Lainy on the All-Region team. The freshmen finished 5th in the Freshman Regionals and the team finished 2nd in the NKAC Championships.

The pool at Scott HS is being rebuilt, so the team had to travel throughout Kentucky and Greater Cincinnati and compete against some of the top teams in Kentucky and Ohio. The AquaPandas kicked off the season by winning the Flying Turkey Invitational at Keating Natatorium (St. Xavier HS) and finished off the regular season with a 3rd place finish in the St. Henry Winter Classic at Union College in Barbourville, KY.



A Perfectionist's Guide to NOT being Perfect, by Bonnie Zucker


