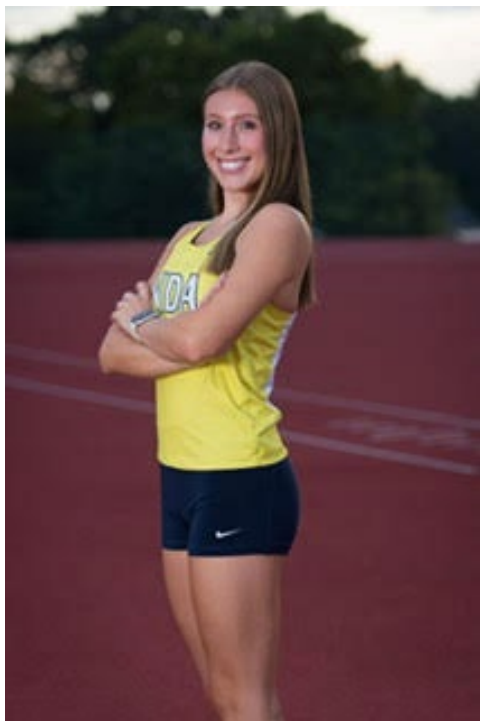

Clare's national championship is an exciting moment for both her and the NDA community, and we look forward to cheering her on as she continues her swimming career.

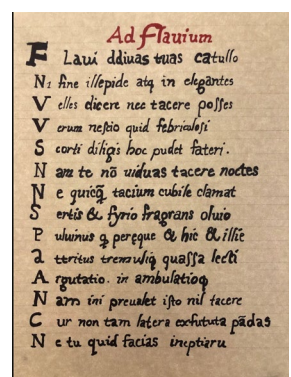
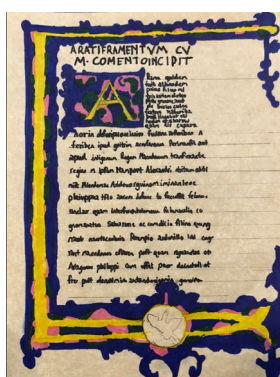
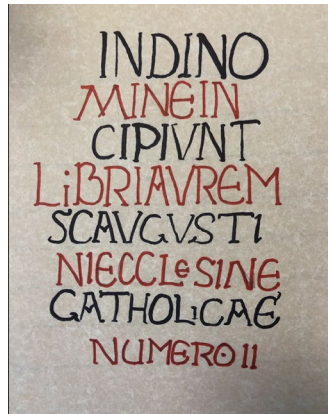
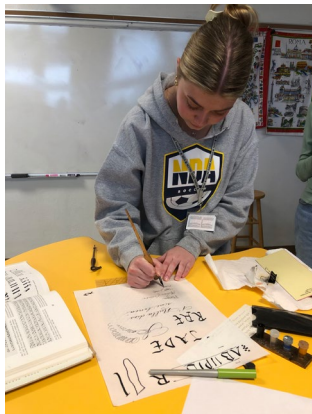
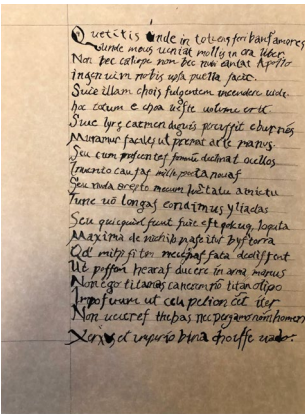
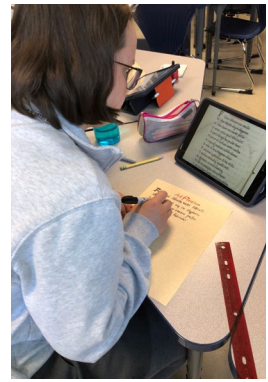
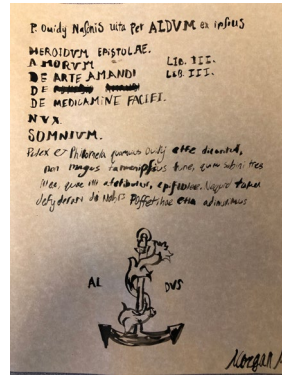
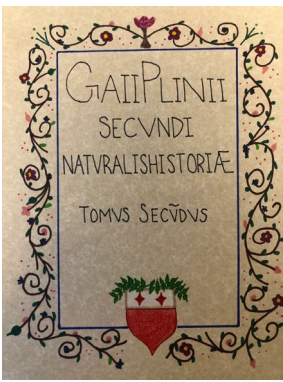
BRINGING LATIN TO LIFE

LATIN STUDENTS STUDY PALEOGRAPHY, MAKE MANUSCRIPTS

Every year the dual credit Latin students do a unit (or two!) on Latin manuscripts: searching through the Vatican Library's extensive online manuscript database to find ones that interest them, learning about the different scripts and writing styles and trying to decipher the Latin texts written in them, and admiring the decorative, color-filled artwork and beauty of these old texts. Students then pick out their favorite manuscript to reproduce the best they can.

This year, NDA alumna and local artist, Marlene Steele, came to class to share her knowledge and expertise, teaching the students some script styles and her calligraphy tips and tricks for their project, and even letting them try their hand at writing with her ink jars and pens. Marlene came to class four years ago for this same project and we were thrilled to have her back with us again!

This project allows students to get a sense of where our modern-day Latin texts and books came from, how they were preserved through the generations, and the incredible care, patience, and artistry that went into making medieval manuscripts. We also take this opportunity to 'nerd out', using various materials to create manuscripts, from Sharpies to colored pencils, and even real feathers and jars of ink to make feather pens!

NDA STUDENTS GAIN INSPIRATION AND INSIGHT DURING A VISIT TO THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY'S ART PROGRAM

Students from Notre Dame Academy's Art 3 and AP Art classes recently had the opportunity to immerse themselves in a collegiate art environment during a visit to the University of Kentucky's art program. The trip offered a firsthand look at how artistic study evolves beyond the high school level, exposing students to new techniques, ideas, and creative pathways.

One of the highlights of the visit was a tour of the university's art museum, where students experienced a diverse range of contemporary and traditional works. Seeing professional pieces up close sparked conversations about composition, meaning, and artistic intent. The group also explored the Creative Arts Living Learning Program, where they learned how students integrate their artistic passions into everyday college life. 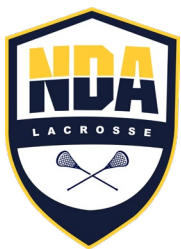

IMPORTANT UPDATE:

DUAL CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY ADJUSTED

Last week, the General Assembly passed the 2026-2028 biennial budget. The budget does not include adequate appropriation amounts to fully fund projected Dual Credit Scholarship disbursements for the upcoming biennium. As a result, KHEAA is adjusting the Dual Credit Scholarship eligibility limits.

The Dual Credit Scholarship eligibility limits are as follows for the 2026-2027 year:

- For students in grades 11 & 12, the scholarship will pay for one (1) General Education dual credit course each year

What does this mean? Only one General Education course will be eligible for the scholarship each year instead of the two courses that have been covered in the past. So, students can either adjust their schedules or families will need to make plans to pay for the additional coursework if your student is currently scheduled to take 2 dual credit courses next year.

I expect that the tuition cost for next year will be \$99/credit hour or \$297 for a 3-credit course and \$396 for a 4-credit course. There is still value in taking more than just the one dual credit course, considering the cost of a degree and classes at a traditional college rate. Dual credit can be worth the investment in saving time and money down the road. As a reference, the average total cost per credit hour at any public postsecondary institution is \$850; the average cost per course is \$2,550 (EducationData.org).
