The students then engaged in a game of wheelchair basketball showcasing the talents of two of the Skool Aid staff members, one of whom plays professional wheelchair basketball. The message was to put goodness and kindness into the world, a message that all of us could use to hear!

Brad Fritz (a graduate of CCH) also spoke to the girls about having grit, faith, tenacity and resilience no matter the circumstance. He spoke from the heart and from experience as he suffered a traumatic brain injury as a high school student. Through his story, students learn to focus on the goodness of life, not to take life for granted, and to persevere through any challenge.

The Department of Disabled American Veterans also visited NDA on Prom Half Day so our students could engage in service and give back to our community. Our students made blankets, cut out flowers for forget me nots and assembled those forget me nots. It was the largest service project that the DAV has ever held and we are honored to have been a part of it.

Some wore throwback and vintage dresses while others donned their dress for this year.
