Dear Parents and Students,

One of our goals in the English Department at Notre Dame Academy is to awaken and intensify a love of reading and writing among our students. As a community of lifelong learners, we believe that reading is a celebration of discovery and imagination rather than merely a task. We place tremendous value on reading at NDA and recognize that our students are avid readers who enjoy exploring new books. With this in mind, we would like to share some exciting news about our new approach to summer reading.



Instead of assigning specific summer reading for our students, this year, we will encourage them to choose books that genuinely interest them to read over the summer. We believe that allowing students to select their own reading material will foster a deeper love for reading and provide them with the opportunity to explore genres and topics that better resonate with their personal interests. We highly encourage parents to discuss their daughter's summer reading selections with them and even read the books together.

While there will not be a general "summer reading" list provided by NDA's English Department this summer, some classes may still require specific summer reading assignments. Please know that any required reading will be communicated directly to students by their respective teachers.

We will continue our tradition of a common reader because we understand the value of a shared literary experience. Rather than reading this book over the summer however, students will read the common reader selection when they return to school in August. Unlike in years past, assignments and curriculum will be designed around the common reader to facilitate meaningful discussions and analysis in the classroom.

Notre Dame Academy will be hosting a book fair on Wednesday, May 8th, in support of celebrating reading this summer with our students. This event will provide students with many opportunities to discover new titles and purchase books for students to read over the summer. 

On Monday, our Latin students commemorated the 2,777th anniversary of Rome's foundation. Rome's "birthday," a holiday known as Natale Di Roma in Italy, is celebrated in Rome with historical reenactments, a parade around the Colosseum, gladiator fights staged in the Circus Maximus, period costumes, and much more. According to legend, Romulus founded Rome as a tiny village on the Palatine Hill in 753 BC, and hstorians have put the day as April 21st. The ancient Romans also celebrated on April 21st, with a spring festival called Parilia. Latin students decorated cookie cakes and read about the Natale Di Roma celebrations in Italy to commemorate this anniversary.


