AP SEMINAR PRESENTATIONS

SOPHOMORES SHOWCASE RESEARCH, CRITICAL THINKING AND REAL-WORLD ANALYSIS

Sophomores in AP Seminar took to the IDEAL innovation space as they delivered their individual multimedia presentations and oral defenses, the concluding component of months of research and analysis. Each student explored a complex, real-world issue of their choosing, crafting a focused argument supported by credible sources and reasoning. During the presentations, students not only showcased their findings, but also defended their argument by responding to two personal questions about the research process, demonstrating their ability to think critically and defend their perspectives.

NDA STUDENTS SUPPORT LOCAL MOTHERS THROUGH SERVICE AND CONNECTION

Twice a year the Diocese of Covington, St. Elizabeth Hospital and various local groups organize a baby shower for low-income pregnant women and mothers of children under 6 months. Nearly 200 people attend the baby shower. Various parishes, schools and organizations combine to give these moms free gifts and check to see that they have the medical assistance they need. Students from Notre Dame Academy came to help, particularly with the Spanish-speaking moms. They handed out baby clothes and blankets. Moms could also use tickets for a raffle of bigger items like strollers and car seats. We appreciate all our volunteers and especially their use of Spanish to make some of the moms feel more comfortable.

NATIONAL FRENCH CONTEST

NDA STUDENTS RANKED NATIONALLY IN LE GRAND CONCOURS



Twelve Notre Dame Academy students have ranked nationally in the 91st annual event, Le Grand Concours. Le Grand Concours is a national competition sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of French. Students were evaluated for their interpretive reading and listening comprehension skills in French. Over 46,000 students competed in the 2026 event.

I hope their accomplishments encourage them to continue to cultivate their interest in the French language and in France and Francophone cultures in the future. I also want to thank all of the teachers who had students compete in the Concours this year; I sincerely appreciate their commitment to expanding their students' opportunities outside the regular curriculum. I am so pleased that the Le Grand Concours continues to be an invaluable part of how the AATF promotes French in the United States.

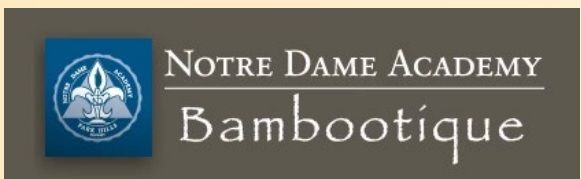

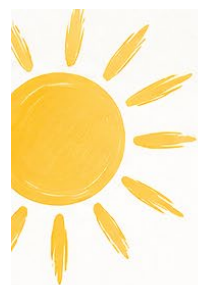
BRINGING ANCIENT CITIES TO LIFE

LATIN 2 STUDENTS DESIGN THEIR OWN ROMAN TOWNS

Latin 2 students recently designed their own Roman towns. Working in groups, they chose a location from the Roman empire, and a water source, for their town, gave it a name, determined what and how many of each kind of public building, housing, temples, shops, restaurants, public entertainment, bathhouses, public restrooms, and other resources and necessities their town would include. They mapped out their designs and drew them out and colored them, thinking through every detail, even the layout for their road systems, fountains, and green spaces.

This project was a fun way for students to get creative, work in teams, and gain a deeper understanding of Roman cities and how they functioned. The students excelled with this project and the results were stunning!

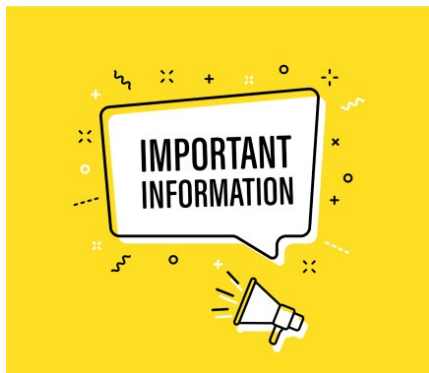

ART 2 STUDENTS EXPLORE MASTERWORKS FIELD TRIP TO LOCAL MUSEUMS INSPIRES CREATIVITY AND DEEPENS ARTISTIC UNDERSTANDING

The Art 2 class at Notre Dame Academy recently took an inspiring field trip to both the Taft Museum of Art and the Cincinnati Art Museum, giving students the opportunity to experience masterworks up close. Walking through the galleries, we encountered paintings by renowned artists such as Rembrandt, Duveneck, Turner, and Duncanson. Seeing these works in person allowed us to better appreciate their scale, texture, and the subtle details.

Throughout the visit, we practiced using art vocabulary to thoughtfully describe what we observed. We discussed elements like composition, value, color, and brushwork, as well as principles such as balance and emphasis. These conversations helped us deepen our understanding of how each artist constructed their work and communicated meaning. It was especially interesting to compare the dramatic lighting of Rembrandt's paintings with the atmospheric qualities found in Turner's landscapes.

One of the highlights of the trip was a collaborative drawing exercise. Working in teams of two, we selected artworks from the museums and attempted to recreate them. This activity challenged us to closely observe proportions, shapes, and details while also communicating effectively with our partners.

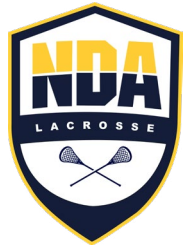
We also had time to independently sketch and reinterpret artworks that stood out to us. This creative exploration allowed us to experiment with our own styles while drawing inspiration from the masters. The ideas and sketches we developed during the trip will serve as valuable references as we begin working on our final pieces back at NDA, making the experience both educational and creatively motivating.

GIVE YOUR STUDENT A STRONG START

ATTENTION CLASS OF 2027 PARENTS

Want your student to get a jump start on the college application process?

Does your student need help with crafting an outstanding college essay?

If so, then your student should attend the CCH College Application Camp this summer! Senior Counselor, Mrs. Jessica Brown, will be hosting a 4-day workshop (8/3-8/6) for seniors to get started on the college application process. This 2.5 hour/day camp session will allow students to have time to work on the application, craft an essay, and create an activity list that highlights their attributes. On the final day of the camp, students will get the opportunity to meet with college reps and get feedback from the experts on their essay and/or application. The reps will also be here to share updates about their schools, and they will also hold a Q&A panel for parents whose student is participating in the camp. So, parents, this is a great time to get all your questions answered on how you can best support your student in the application process. Additionally, NDA will host Application Workshops before school starts and when school is back in session. Attending one of these sessions is mandatory and students will learn more about timelines, deadlines, transcripts, letters of recommendation, SCOIR, and actually START a college application during the workshop. It's a really valuable time for students to gain information and ask all the good questions they might have. See the dates below to plan accordingly. Sign ups will be sent out in July. Students will need to attend an NDA workshop even if they attend the CCH camp.
