

COMMON READER BOOK

Notre Dame Academy has selected next year's Common Reader book which is *Between Shades of Gray* by Ruta Sepetys. *Between Shades of Gray* tells a story from 1941 where fifteen-year-old Lina Vilkas is arrested by the Soviet secret police and deported to Siberia with her mother and younger brother. The author's website says Lina is a young women who fights for her life, vowing that if she survives she will honor her family, and the thousands like hers, by burying her complete story in a jar on Lithuanian soil. Lina's writings and drawings chronicle her fight for survival, her difficulty accepting help from a Soviet guard she's supposed to hate, and her struggle to retain faith in mankind amidst the terror. We look forward to bringing this story to all students, faculty and staff at Notre Dame Academy and celebrating the book's theme when we return next fall.

As your senior year is coming to a close and graduation is quickly approaching, it is time to provide information to assist families in planning for this important milestone.


The graduation celebration begins with the Baccalaureate Mass at 7:00 p.m. on May 25. The Mass will be held at St. Agnes Church. All seniors should attend the Mass and will sit together as a class. Parents/Guardians are invited to attend as well. Seniors should report to the undercroft by 6:45 p.m. They are to wear their graduation gowns but no graduation caps.

On May 26, the Senior Breakfast will be held at Receptions for seniors and their parents/guardians. The breakfast will begin at 8:30 a.m. All seniors will be individually recognized and future plans announced. We realize that many parents/guardians may have to take off work in order to attend the Senior Breakfast, and I hope you will be able to make those arrangements. The cost of the breakfast is \$30.00 per parent. The student cost is included in the graduation fees. Please note that due to space limitations, only parents/guardians may attend the breakfast and seats will be assigned based on preferences. To register go **HERE**. Graduation will begin on May 26 at 4:00 p.m. at the Northern Kentucky Convention Center. Students should arrive by 3:00 p.m. and doors for ticketed guests will open at 3:15 p.m. Tickets are required for graduation. Each student will receive 12 tickets.






ALL-STARS




HONOR AN ATHLETE


NDA ATHLETES' SPORTS PHYSICALS
