We are very fortunate to be designated as a "Heart Safe School" through Project Adam and the Cincinnati Children's Hospital. As part of this designation, we must continue to educate and practice the appropriate responses in the event of a cardiac emergency. Our students reviewed with their teachers and one homeroom went through the process of alerting school officials, calling 911, taking notes, and administering CPR. We greatly value these experiences which keep us thinking, prepared, and informed about what would need to happen in the event of such an emergency. A special thanks to Mrs. Sizemore and Ms. Neubacher who work hard to oversee this drill and the upkeep of our eight AEDs on campus.

MAKE YOUR VOICE HEARD

SUPPORT FEDERAL SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CATHOLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS

The U.S. Congress is currently considering the Educational Choice for Children Act, a bill that would create a scholarship tax credit program at the federal level. If passed, students in all 50 states would be eligible to receive scholarship funds—providing vital support to families seeking a Catholic education for their children.

As many of you know, Kentucky failed to pass Amendment 2 last fall, and our state is falling behind national school choice efforts. This makes it increasingly difficult for families to afford Catholic school tuition and for our parishes to continue their generous subsidies.

This week, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) issued an action alert, encouraging Catholics to urge their representatives to support this important legislation during the upcoming budget reconciliation process.

BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

ART STUDENTS EXPLORE CREATIVITY

Notre Dame Academy's art classes recently enjoyed an exciting two-day field trip filled with creativity, inspiration, and hands-on learning. On the first day, the Art 3 and AP Art students traveled to Louisville, Kentucky, where they began with a tour of the Kentucky School of Art and Design. Students explored the campus and studio spaces, gaining insight into college-level art programs and what it's like to pursue a degree in the visual arts. They then visited the Speed Art Museum, where they viewed a wide range of artwork from classical to contemporary, followed by a tour of the University of Louisville's art department and student galleries. These experiences gave students valuable exposure to professional and academic art environments.

The second day featured a trip to Cincinnati, Ohio, for the Art 2 students. Their first stop was the Taft Museum of Art, where they explored historic works in an intimate and elegant setting. The group then visited the 21c Museum Hotel, where contemporary installations and interactive exhibits blended seamlessly with the hotel's unique atmosphere. The day concluded at the Contemporary Arts Center of Cincinnati, where students engaged with innovative, thought-provoking works by living artists. Throughout the trip, our students were guided by enthusiastic and knowledgeable docents who brought each exhibit to life. We returned to Notre Dame Academy energized and full of fresh inspiration to bring back into our studios and classrooms.










