












## WEEKLY UPDATE COVID-10

COVID-19 cases continue to rise in our community. According to the Kentucky Department of Public Health the state positivity rate has increased to 7.19%. The incident rate has risen in our three Northern counties of KY as well. We are doing our best to keep our community safe and heathy the remainder of this school year. Please be vigilant if your daughter is experiencing symptoms and let us know if someone in your household is being tested for COVID-19 or your daughter is exposed to or tests positive for COVID-19. Please also, stay up-to-date with COVID-19 vaccines.

MCORE Foundation will be back at Notre Dame Academy on Saturday, May 21, 2022, to provide our preventative heart screening program. We have worked with MCORE to provide a screening program to our community since 2019. This is an amazing opportunity for a student to have their heart evaluated for any abnormalities in a cost-effective and convenient manner, especially if they have had Covid-19. #### Governor's School for Entrepreneurs: 3 Students Accepted


