

HANDS-ON PROJECT HELPS SOPHOMORES CONNECT MATH CONCEPTS TO REAL-WORLD CREATIVITY

The sophomores in Mrs. Kroger's honors geometry classes recently brought math to life through a hands-on project focused on surface area and volume. As part of the assignment, students designed and constructed 3D models, applying their knowledge of geometric formulas in a creative and practical way.

The students were able to showcase their creativity in the form of a panda statue made from cardboard, paper, and many other household items, complete with calculated surface area and volume measurements. This project helped students see how geometry connects to the real world. They weren't just memorizing formulas—they were using them to create something meaningful.

SUPPORT THE EDUCATIONAL CHOICE FOR CHILDREN ACT

NDA Families,

Please review the letter below from Mrs. Kendra McGuire. Please consider clicking the link and sending a message to your Congressman. The Educational Choice for Children Act (ECCA) would benefit our Diocesan schools in countless ways. There are quite a few myths surrounding this act and the bill that was on the ballot back in November.

Please keep these points in mind.

- · An estimate of 90% of students could qualify for assistance.
- This does not reduce the funding given to public schools and money is not taken from another government funded entity since it is a tax credit donors fund it.

Dear Parents,

The U.S. Congress is in talks now to pass the Educational Choice for Children Act. This is a scholarship tax credit that would be created at the federal level, and students in ALL 50 states would be eligible for the funds to help offset the cost of Catholic school tuition. As you know, Kentucky failed to pass Amendment 2 last fall, and our state is quickly falling behind in school choice initiatives across the country. This is making it harder and harder for families to afford a Catholic education and for our parishes to subsidize it.


Softball -


Track and Field -


