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
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


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WHEN IN ROME (OR LATIN AT NDA!) LATIN LESSON IN MANUSCRIPTS

Last week, to finish out the last regular week of classes before review week and final exams, this year's Latin 3 dual credit class crafted their own Latin "manuscripts," a second annual project tradition for the spring dual credit Latin 3 class, in which they read poetry of Catullus. Just like the Latin 4's did last spring with this project, the Latin 3's examined virtual scans of several different manuscripts from the Vatican Online Manuscript Library, the different handwriting scripts they were written, the artwork that adorns them, and the various oddities found in manuscripts, including some of the inevitable smudges and mistakes one would expect of monks copying and re-copying the same piece of literature with ink. They then tried their hand at mimicking their favorite manuscript and making their own version of it. While the project was largely done with calligraphy markers, Lea Youtsey was brave enough to complete hers entirely by feather and ink jar and did an amazing job with it!





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
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MAKING A DIFFERENCE ALUMNA VISIT

COMMON READER BOOK

Notre Dame Academy has selected next year's Common Reader book which is *Between Shades of Gray* by Ruta Sepetys. *Between Shades of Gray* tells a story from 1941 where fifteen-year-old Lina Vilkas is arrested by the Soviet secret police and deported to Siberia with her mother and younger brother. The author's website says Lina is a young woman who fights for her life, vowing that if she survives she will honor her family, and the thousands like hers, by burying her complete story in a jar on Lithuanian soil. Lina's writings and drawings chronicle her fight for survival, her difficulty accepting help from a Soviet guard she's supposed to hate, and her struggle to retain faith in mankind amidst the terror. We look forward to bringing this story to all students, faculty and staff at Notre Dame Academy and celebrating the book's theme when we return next fall.




