





UNDERSTANDING KENTUCKY'S KEES PROGRAM


Kentucky Excellence in Education (KEES) Money is earned by every high school student in Kentucky who achieves a 2.5 GPA or higher, for each year of high school. Amounts range from \$125-500 and stack each year, with a bonus (\$36-500) for ACT Scores of 15 and higher. KEES money may be used at any participating college in Kentucky.
