# FINALIZING CELL PHONE POLICY CHANGE

This past school year, the author of *The Anxious Generation* was available for a presentation with various administrators from the greater Cincinnati area. He spoke about his text and the research that he has discovered regarding the detriments of students using cell phones and social media. This presentation was shared with parents and teachers via the Panda Press in the hopes that a new cell phone policy would be the end result. The current cell phone policy at NDA is that students must have their phones off and away from 8-3, however we know that this is not foolproof. We are finalizing some updates to our cell phone policy and invite parents and teachers to attend one of two roundtable meetings to discuss the possible options. Please note - this past March, the Kentucky House of Representatives unanimously passed a bill with a goal of keeping students off of their phones during class. This bill now heads to the Senate. With this in mind, a change is most likely imminent, so our collaboration in supporting this change is crucial.

#### UNIFORMS FOR THE 2025-26 SCHOOL YEAR

#### Approved Uniform pieces are listed below as stated in our Student/Parent Handbook:

Notre Dame Academy has a school uniform that consists of:

- a gray uniform skirt or uniform slacks (the skirt or pants must be the proper size and length, be zipped and buttoned, hemmed appropriately and free of stains, rips, and/or holes). Students are required to obtain a new skirt or pants if it no longer zips, has tears, holes, or stains. Please note: Skirt should extend below student's
  - fingertips when arms are fully extended at one's side.
- · a white or light blue banded Notre Dame Academy polo shirt
- solid white, gray, black or navy blue socks
- appropriate shoes that have a back to them
- name tag/lanyard



Optional items that may be purchased and worn with the uniform include:

- a navy blue Notre Dame Academy sweater vest

#### A REFLECTION FROM THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Earlier this month, several NDA students and chaperones traveled to the Dominican Republic on a mission trip rooted in faith, service and community. In the reflection below, rising senior Jacie Hail shares how this experience deepened her understanding of authentic service and what it means to live as the hands and feet of Christ.



During the first week of June, my classmates, chaperones, and I went on a mission trip to the Dominican Republic (DR), where we stayed and served at an orphanage called Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos. We also got to work at two different sites in the surrounding community, which we focused on improving alongside the local people. As a Spanish student, being immersed in the language was particularly special for me and gave me a new appreciation

for the culture. While in the DR, the immense value of service and community became apparent to me.

I have grown up knowing that service to others is at the core of the Catholic faith however, on this mission trip I realized the importance of intention with regard to service. Service with a spirit of personal gain or moral superiority is not service at all. Because we were working alongside the people that our work would have a positive impact on during this trip, it was easy to remember that service is for the good of the other. This experience showed me that authentic service is an opportunity to become the hands and feet of Christ and vessels of God's love for us.

The joy of the people my classmates and I were surrounded with in the DR, both at the orphanage and the work sites, was palpable. Spending time with the children at the Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos orphanage demonstrated to me that true joy is found within relationships with others and relationship with Christ. Though many of these kids face difficult circumstances in their personal lives, they know that they are not expected to face them alone — a fact that makes all the difference. Additionally, we were blessed to be able to attend Mass at a church in one of the towns close to the orphanage. Their passion for the faith was evident, especially in the music and preaching. This Mass gave me a greater understanding of the significance of community in the DR, as the people's care for one another was obvious and powerful, as well as the universality of the Church. Though we were the outsiders, I felt completely welcomed and accepted there. I am incredibly grateful to the community I was a part of in the Dominican Republic, and though it was only for a short time, I will carry the lessons I learned there into all aspects of my life at home.
