UNIFORMS FOR THE 2024-25 SCHOOL YEAR

Approved Uniform pieces are listed below as stated in our Student/Parent Handbook:

Notre Dame Academy has a school uniform that consists of:

- a gray uniform skirt or uniform slacks (the skirt or pants must be the proper size and length, be zipped and buttoned, hemmed appropriately and free of stains, rips, and/or holes). Students are required to obtain a new skirt or pants if it no longer zips, has tears, holes, or stains. Please note: Skirt should extend below student's fingertips when arms are fully extended at one's side.
- a white or light blue banded Notre Dame Academy polo shirt
- solid white, gray, black or navy blue socks
- · appropriate shoes that have a back to them
- name tag/lanyard

Optional items that may be purchased and worn with the uniform include:

FINALFORMS ACCOUNTS

FinalForms Updates Needed for the 24-25 School Year

Notre Dame Academy partners with FinalForms, an online forms and data management service which allows you to complete and sign forms for your daughter(s) online. FinalForms saves data from year-to-year, meaning you will never need to enter the same information twice! You may review your data at any time throughout the year to verify that it is current.

All parents and students are expected to use FinalForms and complete their updates for next year by July 5, 2024 (if participating in athletics) or by the first day of school. FinalForms will be active for the 2024-25 school year beginning on June 10.

Students who want to participate in athletics must upload a valid, signed KH-SAA physical form in Final Forms before participating in any athletic activities, including conditioning workouts, open gyms and tryouts for all sports. **The KHSAA physical form can be found HERE.**

If you do not have a FinalForms account, please create one account at: https://notredameacademy-ky.finalforms.com and follow the prompts to create the parent account, begin your daughter's account and sign your forms. Your daughter's NDA gmail must be used when setting up her account.

Once the parent/guardian creates the account, the student will be prompted in her NDA email to submit her forms. Please note: if you have already turned in your daughter's immunization record, you do not need to upload it separately. School personnel will upload it for you.

If you already have an account for a current NDA student and need to add another daughter:

Login to your account and click MY STUDENTS to add another student to your account and make any updates for your returning student. Make sure you are updating information for the 24-25 school year.

EXPLORING THE WORLD

NDA STUDENTS' INTERNATIONAL ADVENTURES

This summer, our students had the incredible opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of the world around them with a few distinct international trips, each offering a unique and enriching experience.

ATHENS & THE ISLANDS:

On June 5, 23 students and 4 chaperones (Ms. Dooling - Group Leader, Mr. Stamm, Mrs. Maggard and Ms. Hilbert) embarked on an incredible Greek adventure. The trip began with a few days in Athens, where we took in all the major sites including the Ancient Olympic Stadium, Syntagma Square, and the Acropolis. We also immersed ourselves in the local culture with a cooking class and a visit to the Acropolis Museum. Next, we ventured to the Amfissa Valley and Delphi, exploring an olive farm, the Delphi Museum, and the Temple of Apollo, which provided a serene departure from the bustling city. On our final day in Athens, we took a day trip to Cape Sounion to visit the Temple of Poseidon and ended the day enjoying an in-depth Greek evening excursion where we learned traditional Greek dances and smashed plates!

Our journey continued as we set sail on a cruise, first stopping at Mykonos to experience its unique blend of Turkish, Roman, and Greek influences. In Santorini, we marveled at the beauty of Oia Village, and in Rhodes, we had the opportunity to explore the island on our own, enjoying beautiful beaches and lots of shopping. On board the cruise, the girls enjoyed sunbathing at the pool, eating meals together, and dancing at the disco! We then traveled to Turkey for an excursion to Ancient Ephesus, having the opportunity to walk where Apostle Paul walked and preached.

GERMANY:

It was an amazing experience for Jackie to meet and spend time with Charlotte and Louise's friends. They even went camping during their trip to the Baltic Sea.

PARIS, NORMANDY & LONDON:

On June 10, the French Pandas embarked on an incredible European adventure. The trip began with a few days in Paris, where we took in all the major sites, caught a glimpse of the preparations for the 2024 Olympic Games, and practiced our French language skills.

Next, we set off to the countryside of Northern France, heading to Normandy, which was a pleasant departure from the hustle and bustle of Paris. Just days after the 80th celebration of D-Day, we visited the Caen Memorial, the Normandy beaches, Pointe du Hoc, and the American Cemetery.




2023-24 NDA VOLLEYBALL
