

WEEKLY UPDATE

As of today, Wednesday, August 18, we have had no reported cases of a member of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week. We also currently do not have any students who are required to quarantine due to exposure to COVID-19.

As we move forward, please keep NDA updated on any COVID-19 related issues involving your family. FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE 2021-22 QUARANTINE PROCEDURES

The Quarantine Procedures below were provided by the Diocese of Covington. Parents must report COVID-19 cases to school. Each COVID-19 report will be reviewed and contact tracing will be conducted for the positive case. The guidance below will be used when determining the appropriate actions for each report. This guidance comes from the Kentucky Department of Public Health for schools.

Quarantine Procedures:

When a positive case is identified and reported to the school, contact tracing will be conducted to identify any close contacts to the positive case. A close contact is defined as follows:

• A close contact is someone who was within 6 feet of the positive COVID-19 case for a cumulative total of 15 minutes while the person was considered contagious. The contagious period is 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms.

• Exception: In the classroom setting, students who were at least 3 feet away from the positive case and masked may be excluded as a close contact based on the circumstances and prevention measures in place at the time. This will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis as long as specific details can be obtained and reviewed.

• If a student is deemed a close contact to the positive case, the parents will be notified and provided the close contact letter from the health department. The family may choose from the following quarantine options for their child:

- \cdot Quarantine for 10 days if you have no symptoms.
- Quarantine for 7 days if you have a negative COVID-19 test on or after day 5 and have no symptoms.

• If the close contact lives in the same household as the positive case, the following guidance from the NKY Health Department should be followed:

• The quarantine for a household contact will begin after their last exposure to the positive case. If the contact can separate from the case within the home then they are considered no longer exposed. The quarantine options above may be used.

• If an individual meets the following criteria, she will **not have to quarantine** when considered to be a close contact to a positive case:

• The person has been fully vaccinated and shows no symptoms of COVID-19

• The person has **previously tested positive for COVID-19 and recovered (within the past three months)** and shows no symptoms

• If someone is exempt from quarantine and begins to show symptoms within 14 days of the close contact exposure then he/she must isolate immediately, notify the school, and contact their doctor for treatment/ testing.



SUPPORT YOUR PANDA ATHLETES ELECTRONIC TICKETING

This year NDA will continue with electronic ticketing through GoFan. You will no longer need to wait for a link to be sent to you but can just check the NDA page on GoFan for all ticket links.

We will also be adding an electronic fall sports pass that can be purchased through GoFan and will be good for one adult and immediate children for all fall NDA home games, excluding postseason. (We are not allowed to accept passes for postseason play).

These passes will be accessible on your phone in the GoFan app. The pass will need to be shown and redeemed at the gate of each home game. The passes are not transferable. Each adult would need to purchase their own pass. The cost of the pass is \$40. Immediate children in the family of the pass holder will not have to purchase an additional ticket.
