I would also like to remind our families of something in the **COVID-19 Return to School Requirements from the Diocese of Covington: The Diocese of Covington schools will not require students to get the COVID-19 vaccine. Families are encouraged to explore this option for their eligible children and get the vaccine if it meets your family's needs.**

On behalf of our faculty and staff, please accept my gratitude to you for your support as we continue to navigate some challenging times and for sending your daughters to NDA. We are blessed to have each and every one of them as part of our community and look forward to blessed and productive school year.

FROM THE  
**PRESIDENTIAL SEARCH COMMITTEE**

Dear Notre Dame Academy community,

On behalf of the Presidential Search Committee, we would like to provide you with a brief update on the search process.

As noted in earlier communications, our search professionals from Educational Directions, Mathew Heersche and Risa Oganessoff Heersche, have been recruiting and evaluating candidates over the last several months. They are in the process of finalizing their work with candidates and preparing files for the Search Committee. In general, the candidates have a broad range of experience and the pool includes both sitting presidents/heads as well as those with significant senior administration experience. In terms of geography, the candidates come from different places throughout the entire country.

As a reminder, it is from this group of top candidates that the Search Committee will select the five to seven individuals to be interviewed as semi-finalists. This group will be interviewed by the committee only. It is important to note that candidates are promised confidentiality throughout the search process to the end of the semi-finalist stage. This is consistent with best practices and important for the candidates because of the potential repercussions for them if their present school community knew of their interest while both Notre Dame Academy and the candidates are still in discernment.

After the semi-finalist interviews, finalists are selected by the Search Committee and their names will be announced in an appropriate way to the entire school community. Each finalist will spend time on campus to help them get a sense of our community. These visits are scheduled for early fall 2021 (more detailed information and schedules will be provided prior to these visits).

As a reminder, after the Search Committee has completed its evaluation of all of the data gathered (including deep reference and background checking) and deliberates, it will be presenting its recommendation to the Board of Trustees for its review and final decision. Once this is complete, the Board will make an announcement regarding the new President as soon as possible.

Our search calendar calls for the identification of the next President to be completed this fall. The chosen individual would begin work in July 2021. There will be a variety of opportunities for the new President to meet with members of our community as part of the overall process and to ensure a smooth transition for our new leader.

On behalf of the Board, we thank you in advance for your commitment and support of Notre Dame Academy.



## WEEKLY UPDATE

### COVID-19

As of today, Wednesday, August 25, we have had 2 reported cases of members of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week. We have 2 additional members of our community who are currently in quarantine due to a reported exposure to COVID-19.

## FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE

### DAILY PERSONAL ASSESMENT

Please remember to do your daily personal assessment each day before coming to school:

1. Has the student been tested and tested positive for the virus that causes COVID-19 in the last 14 days?
2. Does the student have a temperature of 100.4 or greater, as measured by a reliable and accurate home thermometer?
3. Does the student have any COVID-19 related symptoms, including persistent non-allergy related cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, chills, muscle pain not attributable to recent activity, sore throat, new rash, GI symptoms (i.e., vomiting or diarrhea), or loss of taste or smell?
4. Has anyone in the student's household been diagnosed with, or showing symptoms of COVID-19?
5. Has anyone in the student's household been in recent close contact (i.e. past 48 hours) with anyone exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 who has tested positive, not been tested, or is waiting for test results?
6. Has the student traveled outside the country or to any high-risk locations in the last 14 days or been in close contact with someone who has traveled to high-risk locations in the past 14 days?

If the answer is "yes" to any of the foregoing questions, the student is not permitted to attend school or any school-related activity, and the student's parents or guardian must contact the school office immediately.



# PARKING LOT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

To ensure the safety and well-being of our students and the children from St. Julie Learning Center, parents and students must understand the parking lot policies and procedures at Notre Dame Academy. Please review our parking lot policies and procedures below:

1. Please be cautious of students walking to and from the parking lot to the school entrance. Students should be crossing at crosswalks.

2. When picking up your daughter after school, please park in an empty numbered spot and advise your daughter to meet you at the car. There is also a row of spots at the front of the parking lot where parents can park in at the end of the day.

**IMPORTANT NOTE: WHEN PARKING, PLEASE BACK INTO YOUR PARKING SPOT TO PROVIDE ADDED SAFETY TO OUR STUDENTS.**

3. For safety purposes and as advised by the Park Hills Fire Department, it is important to keep the parking lot aisles and all fire lanes clear. **PLEASE DO NOT** line up for afternoon pick up in the aisles of the parking lot or in fire lanes. All cars picking up after school **MUST** be either parked in a spot or lined up on the Hilton Drive hill.


4. The back of our parking lot is shared with the Sisters of Notre Dame and Julie Learning Center. Signs have been installed and the spaces left unnumbered for the parking that is needed for the Sisters that live at St. Joseph Heights, their employees and the spaces needed for parents to pick up their children from Julie Learning Center. There is a shift change that takes place at 3:00 p.m. for the workers at the Heights. The Julie Learning Center has pickup that begins at approximately the same time as our dismissal.

5. Students who drive to school need to purchase a parking permit at a cost of \$25.00 for the year. All parked cars must show a parking permit for the current year. Students are to park on the main lot in the student parking area in their designated spot. A car parked on the lot without a permit or in a reserved area will result in a violation. A car parked in a fire lane is subject to police citation and may be towed at the owner's expense.

6. **PLEASE SEE THE PICTURE ABOVE** to see available parking for afternoon pick-up.

We certainly understand that the parking lot can be a frustration at times. We have worked with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet District 6 to look at solutions. They have added additional time to our light to help with our traffic flow at the end of the day.

Thanks for your help in this matter and for keeping the Notre Dame Academy campus safe for not only our students but for the children from St. Julie Learning Center and people at St. Joseph Heights.

For this survey we will only be looking at the following resilience indicators: global satisfaction, grit, hope, leadership, personal standards, positive school experience, and resiliency. The data gathered via Terrace Metrics is kept strictly confidential and only those on the counseling team and administration will have access to the data from the school.
