

And the best part? No school on Friday, August 15 thanks to the Feast of the Assumption.



FINAL FORMS UPDATE

ADDENDUM TO HANDBOOK

The Student and Parent Handbook was uploaded to Final Forms in June, despite the fact that our Cell Phone Policy needed to be revamped. Our deadline for uploading new documents in Final Forms is always early in the summer due to the importance of Final Forms with relation to athletic participation. After offering roundtable discussions for families and holding discussions with faculty, the PMD (personal mobile device) final policy was established (and is posted in this week's PPW). In addition to those updates, we made our problem solving procedures more apparent in the handbook along with our parent partnership expectations. All of this will be uploaded to Final Forms as well and will require one additional signature affirming that you have read and are aware of these updates.



FOSTERING PRESENCE AND FOCUS

NEW CELL PHONE POLICY

In alignment with state-level actions and parent feedback, Notre Dame Academy has implemented a new personal mobile device (PMD) policy for the 2025–26 school year.

Under the policy, all PMDs—including cell phones, smartwatches, AirPods, and personal devices—must be turned off and stored out of sight from 8 a.m. to 2:59 p.m. Any student found with a PMD out or on without permission from the Main Office or Counseling Office will have it confiscated by a school adult and turned over to administration.

Violations carry progressive consequences:

- **First offense:** The PMD must be turned into the office upon arrival every day for one week.
- **Second offense:** The PMD must be turned in daily for one month, and the student will receive a detention.
- **Third offense:** The PMD must be turned in daily for a semester, and the student will receive a Saturday School.
- Fourth offense: The PMD must be turned in daily indefinitely, and a disciplinary and mental health plan will be developed. This may include in-school or out-of-school suspension and a recommendation for professional support.

The decision follows roundtable discussions with parents in late July and reflects growing concern over the impact of mobile devices on student focus, social skills, and mental health. Research shared with families, including findings from Jonathan Haidt's The Anxious Generation, highlighted alarming trends: reduced face-to-face interaction, increased isolation, and a sharp rise in adolescent mental health issues correlated with social media use.

"Our mantra this year is 'Phones Away During the Day," Principal Lisa Timmerding said. "We want our students to be fully present—intellectually, socially, and emotionally—so they can grow into the leaders they are meant to be."

Exceptions will be made for students with documented medical or educational needs. Parents are encouraged to contact the school nurse or administration to arrange accommodations as necessary.




INTEREST MEETING


FALL BLOOD DRIVE



SIGN UP FOR DRUG FREE CLUB!



Drug Free Club partners with families to help their students say no to drugs or substances they might be pressured into trying. Being a part of the club allows a student to say "No, I might get tested" when in a situation where drugs are present. The drug testing is confidential and only parents learn the results if there is a concern. Here at NDA the overwhelming majority of students are in Drug Free Club and we take our job of rewarding students for being Drug Free seriously! We provide rewards such as gift cards, goody bags, hot chocolate mornings, popsicle afternoons and more!

As a freshman you can sign your daughter up for all 4 years and get the senior year free.
