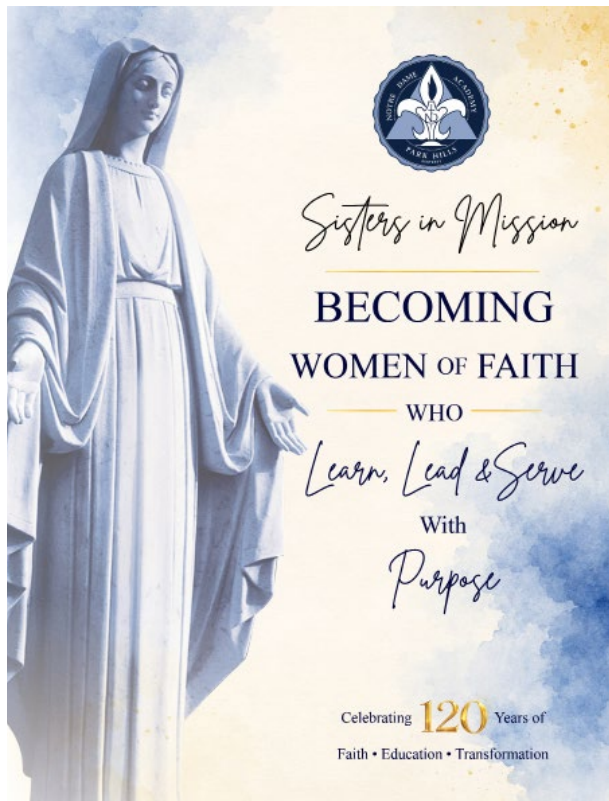

The more, the merrier! Whether you have lots of ideas, love decorating and planning, or simply want to lend a hand, we would love to have you be part of making this special event come to life.

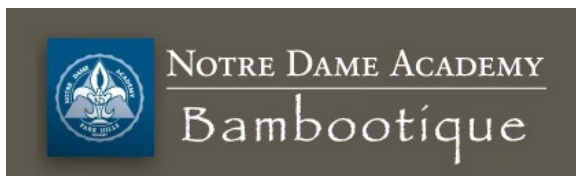

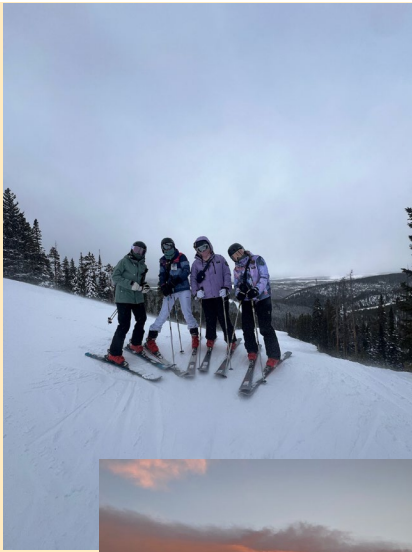

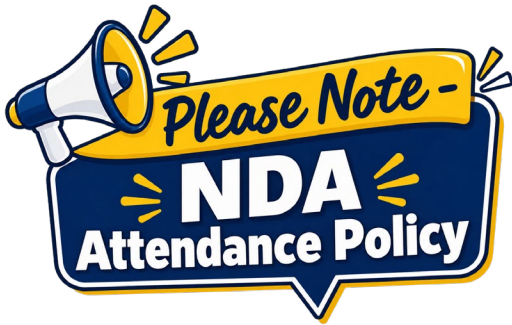
NDA SKI CLUB'S 5TH ANNUAL SKI TRIP!

REAL TALK & REAL HOPE:

SUICIDE PREVENTION EVENT FOR TEENS AND ADULTS

All students and their parents are invited to a very special, first-of-its-kind Suicide Awareness and Prevention event. Cincinnati Children's Zero Suicide, Newport Central Catholic High School and The Blessing List Ministry are partnering together to host "REAL TALK AND REAL HOPE About Suicide Prevention," a free event presented by Journey Advisory Group on September 21 from 6:00-8:30 PM.

The mission is to bring parents and teens together to encourage open, honest conversations about the very difficult topic of suicide prevention. We ALL truly believe in the goal of ZERO suicides and wish to contribute to reaching that goal through hope and education.

The program will include a keynote presentation from a young man who survived a suicide attempt as a teenager. Adults will learn critical, practical things they can do to reduce suicide risk. Teens will have a chance to ask questions of survivors of suicide loss and mental health professionals. They will also have time to talk to each other, building a sense of community and support.
