TRAVELING PANDAS! CONGRATULATIONS

Bella Kampinga, has earned academic honors from the College Board National Recognition Programs by receiving the National Hispanic Recognition Award. The College Board's National Recognition Programs grant underrepresented students with academic honors that can be included on college and scholarship applications and connect students with universities across the country, helping them meaningfully connect to colleges and stand out during the admissions process. Colleges and scholarship programs identify students awarded National African American, Hispanic, Indigenous and/or Rural/Small Town Recognition through College Board's Student Search Service.

"We're thrilled that Bella has earned this recognition," said NDA Principal/Interim President, Mr. Jack VonHandorf. "We are very proud of her for her achievements in the classroom and on her College Board assessments."

Students who may be eligible have a GPA of 3.5 or higher and have excelled on the PSAT/NMSQT or PSAT 10 or earned a score of 3 or higher on two or more AP Exams; and are African American or Black, Hispanic American or Latinx, Indigenous, and/or attend school in a rural area or small town.




TRAVELING PANDAS! **COLORADO SKI TRIP**

EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION ALERT

Notre Dame uses SwiftK12 to communicate emergencies to the school community or to push out messages very quickly. The system syncs up with PowerSchool and uses the phone numbers and emails we have in the system (the same information that families submitted or updated using FinalForms). **A practice alert will be conducted this Thursday at 3:15 p.m.** If you do not receive the message or if there is an error in receipt, please contact the school office, so we can make any necessary changes.

SCHOOL SAFETY ALICE TRAINING

Yesterday, freshmen attended a school safety session that focused primarily on ALICE – NDA's response to an active, internal threat situation. The ALICE program defines response options during active threat situations and mentally prepares our school community to respond in ways that will increase chances of survival.

ALICE is one part of our school's comprehensive safety program and stands for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter and Evacuate. If an internal threat exists, NDA will go into lockdown and all will employ ALICE. If evacuating the building, students, faculty and staff should report to one of two Rally Points, and from there, buses will transport them to NDA's Family Reunification Center where parents/guardians or emergency contacts will be permitted to pick up their daughters.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR STUDENT ATHLETES ATHLETICS COUPON BOOK FUND-RAISER

The Athletics Coupon Book Fund-raiser is required for every NDA Athlete in addition to their athletic participation fee dues.

Coupon Book Selections - Review your selection and sign in Final Forms

Coupon book selections for students participating, or planning to participate, in athletics must be made by September 2nd, 2022. Selections should be made in Final Forms. If no option is selected by a family for your athlete you will automatically fall into the "Sell NO coupon Books option and owe the full amount for selling no books.

If you have already selected an option and signed in Final Forms, you can leave it or log in to Final Forms and edit your selection prior to September 2nd.


You will have 3 options to choose from to fulfill the coupon book fundraiser requirement for student athletes. You will have the opportunity to:

 Sell 18 books for one daughter, 14 books for a second daughter and 8 for a third daughter participating in athletics
 Pay a fund-raising fee and sell half of the books
 Pay a fund-raising fee and sell no books

For one daughter, the selling book option would be to sell 18 books. The half option would be a \$140 fund-raiser fee and selling 9 books. The full fund-raising fee and selling no books for one daughter would be a \$280 fund-raising fee.

For a second daughter, the selling book option would be to sell 14 books. The half option would be a \$110 fund-raising fee and selling 7 books. The no selling book option would be a fund-raising fee of \$220.

For a third daughter, the selling book option would be to sell 8 books. The half option would be a \$65 fund-raising fee and selling 4 books. The no selling book option would be a fund-raising fee of \$130.

SIGN UP TODAY! DRUG FREE CLUB AT NDA

Parents, did you know:

- 1. Children of parents who talk to teens regularly about drugs are 42% less likely to use drugs than those who don't?
- 2. Only 25% of teens report having these conversations with their parents.
- 3. 70% of children who abuse prescription drugs get them from family or friends?

What can you do?

- Educate yourself and your child about the most commonly abused drugs.
- <u>Enroll your child in NDA's Chapter of Drug Free Clubs of America</u>. Applications accepted through Oct. 28. Contact Mrs. Hildreth with questions.

 $\cdot\,$ Talk to your children about the dangers of drug use and drug abuse; once is not enough.

- Set clear boundaries and rules, and monitor behavior.
- Secure your prescription medications in places your child cannot access

 $\cdot\,$ Take inventory of the name and amount of medications you currently have and check regularly to see that nothing is missing.

• Properly dispose of old and unused medications.

 $\cdot\,$ Work with the parents of your children's friends to set common boundaries and monitor behavior so that rules are respected and enforced

• Set a good example for your family and friends. Your children ARE watching!



CLEP COLLEGE-LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAM

CollegeBoard CLEP

CLEP (College-Level Examination Program), is a credit-by-examination program that allows students to earn college credit. CLEP exams are offered year-round at more than 2,000 test centers, and anyone can take a CLEP exam. CLEP is sponsored by College Board, the same organization that sponsors Advanced Placement (AP) Exams.

Students can earn credit for what they already know with qualifying scores on any of the <u>30+ Exams Available</u>. Many of the CLEP tests satisfy various General Education requirements at colleges, and cost ~\$90/test. For more information visit the <u>CLEP Website</u>. THE KY GOVERNOR'S SCHOLARS PROGRAM

GSP is a 5-week summer residential program for outstanding KY students after completing their junior year of high school. Established in 1983, the program provides academic and personal growth through a strong liberal arts program balanced with a full co-curricular and residential life experience while living on a college campus. Students complete an application and compete with others from across the state. The Program's mission is to enhance Kentucky's next generation of civic and economic leaders. Those selected attend the program free of charge. The <u>GSP website</u> has basic information and will be updated in September with information for GSP 2023.

GSA THE KY GOVERNOR'S SCHOOL FOR THE ARTS

GSA is a free arts-intensive three-week residential summer program held on the campus of the University of Kentucky. The program is for Kentucky student artists in the 10th and 11th grades at the time of application. GSA offers instruction and immersion in nine different art forms: Architecture, Creative Writing, Dance, Drama, Instrumental Music, Musical Theater, New Media, Visual Art, and Vocal Music.

A GSA Informational Meeting will be held on Thursday, September 29 after school in Alumnae Hall for those interested in learning more, but prospective applicants can learn more by visiting the <u>GSA Website</u>. Application and ArtShop registration will become available online in the fall.

GSE exposes young aspiring entrepreneurs to the mindset, culture, innovative thinking, and skills necessary to start a company. This free 3-week summer residential program gives Kentucky high school students (in 9th, 10th, and 11th grades at the time of application) a hands-on opportunity to turn their ideas into business opportunities.
