

WEEKLY UPDATE

As of today, Wednesday, September 8, we have had 3 new reported cases of members of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week. We have 7 additional members of our community who are currently in quarantine due to a reported exposure to COVID-19 or who are awaiting test results.

FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE DIOCESAN COVID-19 UPDATE

On Friday, September 3, you should have received a letter from Mr. VonHandorf via email informing you of a change in the Diocesan masking plans. With the holiday weekend, all schools in the Diocese are requiring masking starting yesterday, Tuesday, September 7. This is an extra precaution to help maintain in-person instruction for students.

Along with Mr. VonHandorf's letter, you received two attachments: a letter from Kendra McGuire, Superintendent of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Covington and an updated Diocesan COVID-19 Return to School Requirements for the 2021-22 School Year with updated protocols. Just a reminder - you can find all of NDA's COVID-19 information including our *Pandas Return to Campus Plan* as well as all of the COVID-19 communications from the Diocese of Covington on our COVID-19 Information page of the website <u>HERE</u>.

As stated in the letter from Mr. VonHandorf last week, Notre Dame Academy already has a mask requirement in place. That requirement will remain in place until further notice. We will continue to review case data information daily and reevaluate our policies and protocols weekly.






MORE ABOUT COMMON READER DAY

Parents and Guardians: Drug Free Club at Notre Dame Academy has most students currently signed up, but many have not yet signed up. What is keeping you from signing up your daughter for Drug Free Club at NDA? To refute some possible reasons:

1. My daughter does/will not use drugs, so I don't want to pay for this.

The cost of membership is \$25 (Notre Dame pays \$10 of the regular \$35 cost), which includes all kinds of rewards and prizes. Don't you want to reward your daughter for being drug-free? And to receive the same rewards her drug-free friends are receiving? Don't you desire her to have the associations and to be a known active member of Drug Free Club? Don't you want your daughter to be able to list Drug Free Club membership on her college applications and resumes? **At NDA, it's COOL to be IN Drug Free Club!**





How to become a Drug Free Club member at NDA:

- Apply and pay: Submit your one-page paper application and payment to the office or do so online <u>HERE</u>. The fee is \$25/year. If freshmen sign up for 3 years (\$75), their senior year is free.
- 2. Test drug free.
- 3. Receive your ID Card at school.
- 4. Enjoy rewards from school and from our local community!
- 5. Stay drug free! Random drug tests can come at any time.
