This week, we celebrate a remarkable milestone for Notre Dame Academy. NDA has once again been recognized on the national stage for academic excellence and Catholic education. The Council for American Private Education has nominated NDA as a 2025 National Blue Ribbon School — the fourth time in our history we have earned this distinction. This makes us the only Catholic high school in the Diocese of Covington to receive this honor four times and one of just two private schools in Kentucky recognized this year. We congratulate Newport Central Catholic on receiving their first Blue Ribbon nomination this year.

On Tuesday, our school community came together for Blue Ribbon Day — a joyful and faith-filled celebration of this achievement. The halls rang with "blue" music between classes, every student received a Blue Ribbon T-shirt and necklace, and we shared 500 cups of blue ice cream at lunch. Our day concluded with a spirited all-school assembly featuring prayer, reflection, a school-wide game, confetti cannons, and the NDA band. The energy in the gym captured the pride, gratitude and spirit of Panda Nation.

This honor is not just about awards. It is a reflection of our mission — to educate young women to make a difference in the world through faith, excellence, leadership and service. It affirms the daily commitment of our students, the extraordinary dedication of our faculty and staff, and the unwavering support of our families, alumnae and friends.

As we look ahead, I invite you to join us for Parent Mini Night on Tuesday, September 30. This special evening gives you the chance to step into your daughter's shoes, follow her schedule, and meet the teachers who inspire and guide her each day. It is a meaningful way to connect with her academic journey, experience the NDA spirit, and witness the passion and dedication of our faculty in action.

UNIFORM SKIRT REMINDER



FUTURE PANDAS VISIT CAMPUS

Notre Dame Academy recently welcomed 8th grade students from Blessed Sacrament School and St. Pius X School to campus for special shadow days. These visits gave students the chance to explore NDA's classes, meet our faculty, and experience Panda life firsthand.

In the science lab, Blessed Sacrament students extracted DNA from strawberries and joined our science department for an exciting combustion experiment. They also spent time in textiles, where they created scrunchies and observed NDA students sewing zipper bags.

The following week, we gave a big Panda welcome to the 8th graders from St. Pius X! Their visit included observing our Honors Computer Science class, where NDA seniors guided them through hands-on coding fun. They also rolled up their sleeves in the science lab to extract DNA from strawberries and participate in a combustion experiment — a true Panda STEM adventure!

It was a joy to share the NDA experience with both Blessed Sacrament and St. Pius X students. We hope their time on campus gave them a glimpse of the many opportunities and experiences that await them as future Pandas!

LAYERS OF IDENTITY

EXPLORING MIXED MEDIA PORTRAITS

In this mixed media project, our students began by creating a detailed charcoal portrait of a person of their choosing whether a celebrity, a friend, or a family member. Charcoal allowed them to explore strong contrasts, shading techniques, and expressive mark making to capture the likeness and personality of their subject. Once the foundation of the portrait was complete, students expanded their work by integrating collage elements. These collage additions were carefully selected to symbolize and represent aspects of the individual's identity, interests, or story, adding layers of meaning beyond the traditional portrait.

To push the work further, students were challenged to incorporate acrylic paint into the composition, uniting all three mediums charcoal, collage, and paint into a cohesive piece. The combination of textures, colors, and materials required creative problem-solving as students worked to balance the different elements without losing the clarity of their subject. This project encouraged them to think deeply about how visual choices communicate identity while practicing advanced skills in composition, contrast, and mixed media techniques. The final artworks not only showcased technical ability but also expressed the individuality and character of the chosen person through a thoughtful blend of mediums.


