UNIFORM POLICY DRESS CODE

The weather is turning cooler, and this is always a good time to revisit our uniform policy. Notre Dame Academy has a school uniform that consists of:

- a gray uniform skirt or uniform slacks (the skirt or pants must fit properly, be zipped and buttoned, hemmed appropriately and free of stains, rips, and/or holes). Skirt length must reach below one's fingertips when arms are fully extended at side
- a white or light blue banded Notre Dame Academy polo shirt
- solid white, gray, black or navy blue socks
- appropriate shoes that have a back to them
- lanyard

Optional items that may be purchased and worn with the uniform include:

- a navy blue Notre Dame Academy pullover sweater, cardigan sweater, sweater vest, fleece or sweatshirt (available for pur chase through Schoolbelles and NDA's Bambootique)
- a navy blue blazer with NDA's emblem for special occasions such as Mass, award ceremonies, etc.
- gray, black, or navy blue leggings; sweatpants are not permitted under uniform skirts

CLEP

COLLEGE-LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAM



CLEP (College-Level Examination Program), is a credit-by-examination program that allows students to earn college credit. CLEP exams are offered year-round at more than 2,000 test centers, and anyone can take a CLEP exam. CLEP is sponsored by College Board, the same organization that sponsors Advanced Placement (AP) Exams.

Students can earn credit for what they already know with qualifying scores on any of the <u>30+ Exams Available</u>. Many of the CLEP tests satisfy various General Education requirements at colleges, and cost ~\$90/test. For more information visit the <u>CLEP Website</u>. GSP is a 5-week summer residential program for outstanding KY students after completing their junior year of high school. Established in 1983, the program provides academic and personal growth through a strong liberal arts program balanced with a full co-curricular and residential life experience while living on a college campus. Students complete an application and compete with others from across the state. The Program's mission is to enhance Kentucky's next generation of civic and economic leaders. 
GOVERNOR'S SCHOOL FOR ENTREPRENEURS
