## What Is Empowerment Self-Defense?



Empowerment Self-Defense (ESD) is a comprehensive, evidence-based, trauma-informed approach to resisting and preventing violence that


- focuses on the full range of gender-based violence, from everyday harassment to lifethreatening situations.
- is grounded in empirical evidence about assaults and the kinds of responses that are most likely to stop them.
- recognizes that most assaults are perpetrated by acquaintances and intimates, and provides strategies appropriate for these situations.
- includes boundary-setting, de-escalation, and verbal self-defense strategies as well as physical techniques. These skills empower students to stop assaults in their early stages, before they escalate to physical danger.
- teaches effective physical tactics that require minutes rather than years to master and can be adapted for any body.
- offers a "toolbox" of strategies for avoiding and interrupting violence and empowers students to choose the options that are appropriate for their own situation.
- expands students' freedom and agency, empowering them to make their own choices about where they go, what they do, and who they do it with.
- addresses the social conditions that facilitate sexual assault and the psychological barriers to self-defense that make resistance difficult for women and other marginalized groups.

# SUICIDE PREVENTION TRAINING FOR PARENTS AT NDA

With suicide being the second-leading cause of death among people ages 15-24, the National Alliance on Mental Illness calls for a increase in suicide prevention initiaives and conversations surrounding mental health and depression with our youth. Larry McNabb is a local Vocational Rehabilitation Certified Counselor and a Master Trainer with the QPR Institute and will be presenting a Suicide Prevention Training for parents at Notre Dame Academy on November 14 from 6:30 p.m to 8:00 p.m. QPR stands for Question, Persuade, Refer and the training will help you recognize the warning signs of suicide, know how to offer hope, and know how to get help to save someone's life. Please make plans to attend if you can. NDA's faculty and staff completed QPR training in August during our annual back to school meetings and students will be trained by grade levels through the next several weeks. This is an important step in our ongoing efforts to eliminate suicide rates in our young adult populations.

## **GREEN DOT TRAINING**

These sophomore, junior, and senior Pandas (and three more who were dismissed early) were trained in Green Dot last Wednesday! Green Dot is a Bystander Action Plan created to prevent violence and keep everyone around us safe. They learned and practiced proven strategies that prevent and reduce bullying, dating violence, and sexual assault, either Directly, through Delegation, or Distraction. Freshmen will have an overview of the Green Dot Program in an upcoming Health class. Others have filed for multiple patents and developed new ideas and relationships that sow the seeds for more business formation. ## 2 - Why should we reward her for something we expect of her anyway?


A - Drug Free Club is a form of Positive peer pressure! It helps students resist the temptations to make poor choices. Their brains are not fully developed yet, which can make them weak during impulsive moments. This could be the difference between them saying Yes and NO in an unexpected difficult moment.

## Q - My daughter may have used something; I don't want her to get in trouble for it

A - The school never gets the results of the drug tests. DFCA informs parents directly about positive results, allowing them to handle the results and get any help as they best see fit. If a student is taking a medication, Drug Free Club contacts parents to verify the medication and amount.
