A CLASSROOM OF COMPASSION:

UNDERSTANDING IMMIGRATION THROUGH CATHOLIC PRINCIPLES

This week during Catholic Social Teaching with the junior class, the Religion Department highlighted the topic of Immigration. The presentation began with Mrs. Abott surveying the students regarding their background and heritage. This was an eye opening experience for all as many of them then shared personal stories about the journeys of their families into the United States. Our very own Mrs. Sullivan shared her immigration story about her journey from Ireland to the United States. The focus then transferred to the church's teaching on immigration and a few documents that have been publicized and are relevant to what is going on in the United States today. It is always important for our students to focus on the truth taught by the church and the lens of Catholic Social Teaching. The teachers focused on the root causes for immigration and then the five main points from Catholic Social Teaching on Immigration. A video from Father Mike Schmidt was also shared where he discussed the principles of immigration based on the teachings of the Catholic Church and the catechisms that provide guidance for our faith. He suggested that we need to hold on to the principles as we search and pray for answers. Our students demonstrated an incredible understanding that our thoughts on immigration can support and uphold the dignity of the human person, while also believing in the obligation of our country to protect its borders. They were able to recognize that part of the discord in our country is related to very polarized views that do not have to be that way. They responded to a journal prompt to conclude the session and were able to read an article published by "Catholic Vote." It is linked here for your viewing as well.

SUPPORTING OUR STUDENTS

PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

At Notre Dame Academy, we are committed to fostering open and consistent communication among parents, students, and teachers. In place of a single designated conference night, we encourage parents to initiate conferences at any time throughout the school year. Should you wish to discuss your daughter's academic progress, social development, or any specific needs, please feel free to contact her teachers to arrange a meeting. Additionally, if a student is struggling in a particular class, the teacher will reach out to schedule a conference, as this is a required component of our failure policy. Together, we can ensure that each student receives the support necessary for her continued growth and success.

The article above was included in the PPW last week as we began the second quarter of our school year. It was brought to our attention that this may not have aligned with previous communication sent specifically to our freshmen students. We wanted to provide context and a further explanation if you are also new to NDA and hoping to set up conferences with your daughter's teacher(s) throughout the year.

Prior to Covid, NDA held a conference day for in-person conferences and parents could schedule conferences with all six or seven of their daughter's teachers or just the teachers of the classes where there was a concern. During Covid, all schools quickly learned that conferences could be held virtually, so that has been our process since that time. In recent years, teachers have offered a few hours on a designated day for parents to schedule conferences. The faculty and administration evaluated this conference plan due to the lack of parent participation in years past and the inconvenience of just a day. Most teachers offered these conferences via Zoom or Google Meet, so we determined that this could happen at any time. Please feel free to reach out to your daughter's teachers and request a conference. The teachers will give you some available days and times and you should be able to do a virtual conference with each of them and ask any questions that you may have. Feel free to contact the office if you have questions.



During homeroom, each grade level will gather in designated spaces for the costume contest. One student or group per grade will advance to the final round, judged by a panel in the CLC.


Following the contest, students may choose from several fun activities across campus, including:




CALLING ALL FUTURE LEADERS


FRIGHTFULLY FUN FACTS
