



CRITICAL THINKING!

On Friday December 1, our students will engage in a critical thinking exercise centered around the ALICE protocols. The students will be given hypothetical scenarios and situations that could occur and impact the safety of our school. With groups, the girls will have to determine how to respond to these situations to uphold the safety of themselves and others. ALICE stands for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate. THUMBS UP FOR AP STATS!

PANDAS AP® STATISTICS CLASS DIVES INTO EARTH'S WATERY MYSTERIES

Pandas AP® Statistics class takes the task of inference to a new level by attempting to predict the percent of the earth's surface that is water. As these globes were tossed the class recorded the location of their right thumb. (Water or Land)

After taking SIX random samples of size 30 each, their results underestimated the true proportion of surface water by 10%, however, their results did show the beginnings of a normal distribution.

Several discussions were had regarding the validity of their sampling technique. The students and their teacher, Mr. Greg Cerimele, decided that by using the right thumb as the marker, they collected data that was biased toward the lower side. Rivers and lakes were too small for a thumb to pick up so they were counted as land.

Their sample indicated that the earth is covered by 60% water when in fact it is covered by 70% water!

Math Club and Mu Alpha Theta (NDA's Math Honors Society) gathered for their monthly meeting on Monday. The members of Mu Alpha Theta started their work on the required "Math Minutes" video with their chosen groups. Each group will create one video lesson on any secondary math topic. Members of our chapter will vote to nominate 3 videos and these will be submitted to the national contest.
