# FROM THE SCHOOL NURSES UPDATED COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

Dear Parents,

As you know, each Friday we will determine the upcoming week's masking protcol at NDA based on the data released by the Kentucky Department of Public Health (KDPH) each Thursday (Friday if Thursday is a holiday) as per the <u>Dioc</u>esan COVID-19 Return to School Requirements. You can find this data here: <u>https://govstatus.egov.com/kycovid19.</u>

In the data released last Friday, Kenton County was in the **RED ZONE** at 26.8 - High Community Transmission (>25+ per 100K) therefore **masks are required at NDA November 15-21, 2021**. We will send an email to all students and parents each Friday afternoon to communicate the mask protocol for the following week based on Thursday's data. You can also find NDA's weekly masking protocol in our student bulletin.

Moving forward we are likely to see changes in the weekly data due to holidays, colder weather, increased travel etc. and therefore, we are likely to see changes from week to week in our masking protocol. While weekly changes may be disconcerting to some, on a positive note, there may be weeks such as last week, when we can remove the mask requirement if the data suggests that it is safe to do so.

Once again we would like to thank you for your patience as we continue to do our best to protect the health and wellbeing of our students, faculty and staff while meeting our responsibility to educate our students and provide them with in-person instruction. We appreciate the cooperation of our NDA community as we respond to the constantly changing situations presented by COVID-19.


#### SCHEDULE CHANGE

### HANDBOOK HIGHLIGHTS

#### Dances p. 18

Dances that are held at Notre Dame and Covington Catholic are school-sponsored events and drug free. Appropriate dress, behavior and dancing are expected. Random breathalyzer tests and purse searches may occur. Students who do not follow the rules will be asked to leave after the parents have been notified and rides will be arranged if necessary.

#### Special Occasions p. 24

Students sometimes have the opportunity to dress up for events such as Silver Bells, Junior/Senior Prom, Mother/Daughter and Father/ Daughter dances, special senior events, and theatrical performances. At these times it is expected that students dress in a way that is acceptable for young women attending a Catholic high school. This includes appropriate dress or skirt length and coverage of the stomach, back, and chest areas.

#### In Summary, dance attire must:

- Provide proper coverage of the chest area (no cleavage or plunging necklines). Modesty panels could be added to a dress to address this issue.
- Strapless and spaghetti strap dresses are acceptable as long as they meet other dress code expectations.
- Be long enough. The length of the dress should extend below one's fingertips when arms are fully extended at sides. This applies to the shortest hem of the dress (consider an asymmetrical dress).
- An open back is acceptable; however, the open back must not extend below the lower curvature of one's back.
- Cover stomach and midriff areas. Cut-outs are not approved. A mesh layer or material could be added to the dress to cover the exposed areas.
- Mask requirement is TBD, and this will be decided as we near the event's date.



## 2023 Synod on Synodality: The Church Wants to Hear From You!

Pope Francis has called for a worldwide discussion leading up to the next meeting of the Synod of Bishops in 2023 on the topic of SYNODALITY. Synodality is "journeying together" - a way of living out our faith that involves shared responsibility, open and honest dialogue, and discernment with the Holy Spirit in addressing the issues facing our Church today. It is speaking and listening to one another and the Holy Spirit. In what ways does our parish journey together? How well do we do it? Are there people or groups that have been left behind on the journey? How can we speak and listen to them? Parishes, institutions, individuals, and small groups across the diocese will have the opportunity to reflect and respond to these and other questions over the next several months. All are invited and encouraged to participate. Input will be compiled and forwarded on to the national and then international levels to help the Bishops prepare for the 2023 Synod in Rome.
