CLASH OF CANS

Congratulations to our amazing Pandas on winning this year's Clash of Cans canned food competition and collecting an incredible number of canned food items for St. Vincent de Paul. This year, St. Henry's 425 students collected 7,298 cans in total averaging 17.17 cans per student and our 492 NDA students collected 13,469 cans averaging 27.38 cans per student!

EXAM SCHEDULE






ATTENTION FRESHMEN

NDA SENIOR AWARDED NATIONAL AWARD/SCHOLARSHIP

NDA senior, Sergeant Emmalyn Martin, has been honored with the national Jimmy Trimble Scholarship from the American Veterans Center. As a dedicated member of the Young Marines, a national youth organization for youth aged eight through high school graduation, Emmalyn, who joined the Northern Kentucky Young Marines in 2019 at the age of 12, stands out for her commitment and leadership. Emmalyn received this prestigious award during the 26th Annual Conference of the American Veterans Center on November 4 at the Omni Shoreham Hotel in Washington, D.C.

The Jimmy Trimble Scholarship is bestowed annually upon a Young Marine who embodies the admirable qualities of James "Jimmy" Trimble III. Trimble, a talented athlete, chose to serve in the Marines over pursuing a career in professional baseball. Known for his focus and dedication to serving his country, Trimble tragically lost his life at the age of 19 on March 1, 1945, during combat on Iwo Jima. The award recognizes Martin's commitment to the values and principles exemplified by Jimmy Trimble, honoring her dedication to service and leadership within the Young Marines organization.






















NDA TALENTS SHINE IN TMU HIGH SCHOOL JURIED EXHIBITION
