



SOLIDARITY AND SUBSIDIARITY MAKING A DIFFERENCE THROUGH MICRO FINANCING

Mrs. Wagner's Catholic Social Teaching classes have been learning about solidarity (we are all connected) and subsidiarity (solving problems at the lowest competent level of authority) for the last several weeks and how we can make a difference in people's lives with those concepts in mind. The way that they are doing that is through partnering with Kiva, a microfinancing organization, to help fund small loans for people around the world that will allow them to improve their lives, the lives of their families, and the lives of their communities. Each student brought in money to help finance a loan of their class's choosing. They chose to help finance loans for Vannak and Iroda, women in Cambodia and Tajikistan, who need help paying medical bills for their family members so that they can continue to provide for their family's daily needs. These women will pay back these loans over the next year. Mrs. Wagner's classes have been doing this project since 2017 and have been able to loan over \$2,500 to individuals all over the world between their donations and re-lending what has been repaid from previous loans.

Notre Dame Academy (NDA) is searching for a part-time Nurse (RN or LPN) to help manage and oversee the overall physical wellbeing of our students. The nurse is responsible for assessing students who are ill, administering authorized medications and performing basic first aid as needed. The nurse will also be responsible for accurate record keeping and maintaining and applying school protocols related to COVID-19, other illnesses and/or physical impairments.

Hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., two to three days per week during the school year. The position reports to the principal.

Strong communication and organizational skills are required. Proficiency with email and spreadsheets is also necessary. A current Kentucky nursing license is required. Current BLS CPR certification preferred. A background check, valid driver's license and Virtus training is also required.

NOTHING BUT NET BASKETBALL NEWS


Basketball won their home opener against NCC last night! JV also beat NCC and the Freshmen team beat Mount Notre Dame in an away game yesterday. Go Pandas!
