On Monday, dual credit Latin students celebrated the Latin program's 3rd annual Roman food day. This student-led tradition started in a Latin 3 class three years ago with an interest in learning more about Roman food and cooking, inspired by the Roman gourmet Apicius, whose extensive cookbook of recipes in Latin still survives. It has continued to be a wonderful way to experience Roman eating first-hand and lead into the Thanksgiving holiday together.

Each year, students research and choose an authentic Roman recipe to recreate. This year's menu featured Pompeiian style pizza, hand-pressed cheese, honey sesame cookies, panis focacius (Roman flatbread, the ancient ancestor of modern-day focaccia), a few different kinds and styles of honey cake, and Roman cheese fritters. # EXPLORING OCEAN LIFE AT THE NEWPORT AQUARIUM

Students in Mr. Bill Stamm's Marine Biology class recently explored the Newport Aquarium, bringing their classroom learning to life through hands-on observation and discovery. The trip offered students the chance to study marine habitats, animal behavior and aquatic ecosystems up close.

Throughout the day, students observed a wide range of species — from sharks and stingrays to coral reef fish and freshwater creatures — deepening their understanding of biodiversity and conservation. They also had opportunities to ask questions, and connect what they've learned in class to real-world marine science.

## PANDAS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

This year's Canned Food Drive came to an amazing close following our Thanksgiving Prayer Service, where we announced that our NDA community collected 15,013 canned goods and nonperishable items for the St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry. This brings our 16-year total to an extraordinary 166,625 items — a testament to what servant leadership looks like when lived out with heart, intention and purpose.

The timing of this announcement felt especially meaningful as our community had just gathered for our annual Thanksgiving Prayer Service, a tradition that grounds us in gratitude and reminds us that service is at the core of who we are. Senior Jacie Hail shared a powerful reflection from her mission trip to the Dominican Republic, reminding us that authentic service is not about what we gain but about how we love: "Service with a spirit of personal gain or moral superiority is not service at all... authentic service is an opportunity to become the hands and feet of Christ and vessels of God's love for us." Her words captured the spirit behind this drive and the generosity our students show year after year.

This year's 15,013 items will help keep pantry shelves stocked well into the summer months, supporting hundreds of families served monthly by St. Vincent de Paul. From creative incentives to friendly grade-level competitions, our Pandas once again showed what it means to step up for others.

Thank you to every student, family, faculty member and staff member who contributed. Your generosity continues to reflect the charism of the Sisters of Notre Dame and the mission we strive to live every day.






