

Dear Parents,

Please continue to encourage your daughter to stay healthy during exam week. We suggest that students prioritize sleep, eat well, hydrate, minimize stress and exercise to help them feel their best so that they can do their best this week.

In the data released last week, Kenton County was in the **RED ZONE** at 43.7 - High Community Transmission (>25+ per 100K) therefore masks are required at NDA December 13 - 19, 2021. NDA will send an email to all students and parents the week before we come back from Christmas break to communicate the mask protocol for the week of January 3, 2022.






SAVE A LIFE
