- In 1968 students all wore elbow length white gloves to Prom?
- In 1907, the Sisters of Notre Dame purchased 6 acres of land and one brick residence on Lexington Pike (now known as Dixie Highway) in rural Kenton County. That residence still stands and today and is now the Park Hills Animal Hospital.
- For the 1909-1910 school year the tuition at Notre Dame Academy for the commercial and scientific programs of study was \$3.
- The Panda became the Notre Dame Academy mascot in the 1974-1975 school year.

EDGAR LEARNS LATIN: PART 2

HANDS ON LEARNING IN LATIN **MAKING MOSAICS**

Mosaics were a popular form of art and adornment in Roman buildings, bathhouses, shops and private residences. They were made from tesserae, which were small, colored stones, or from glass pieces. Countless well-preserved Roman mosaics have been uncovered not only around Pompeii, Ostia, Rome and other parts of Italy, but as far as the Roman Empire spanned, including the UK and Africa.

The Latin 1 and Latin 2 classes tried their hand at creating their own Roman mosaics this week, with the Latin 1 students using different colored dried beans to mimic the Romans' colored stones and the Latin 2 students using small squares of paper to their mimic glass tiles. While the project is still on-going in both these classes, the Latin 1 students made significant progress on theirs this week and they are turning out beautifully! Even Edgar (accompanied by Nurse Julie) stopped by for a bit to spend time with the students and lend a paw!




HEART HEALTHY
