Monday was a great day to celebrate at Notre Dame Academy! That afternoon we gathered to celebrate two important initiatives: becoming a Heart Safe School and establishing a Hope Squad at NDA!

Through the help of one of our alumnae, we partnered with Cincinnati Children's Heart Institute in November to help NDA achieve a fully functioning school-based CPR-AED program and today we received the national distinction as a "Heart Safe School" by Project ADAM and Cincinnati Children's Heart Institute. The Project ADAM team from Cincinnati Children's came to NDA today to present our student body with a banner for this special recognition and congratulated our school community on becoming the **FIRST SCHOOL IN KENTUCKY** to receive this distinction.

We also took time to celebrate the fact that Notre Dame Academy is also the **FIRST SCHOOL IN THE STATE OF KENTUCKY** to have a HOPE Squad which is a school-based, peer to peer, suicide prevention program that emphasizes suicide prevention fundamentals, self-care and anti-bullying.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

FINALFORMS UPDATES NEEDED FOR THE 23-24 SCHOOL YEAR

Notre Dame Academy partners with FinalForms, an online forms and data management service which allows you to complete and sign forms for your daughter(s) online. FinalForms saves data from year-to-year, meaning you will never need to enter the same information twice! You may review your data at any time throughout the year to verify that it is current. **All parents and students are expected to use FinalForms and complete their updates for next year by June 1, 2023 (if participating in athletics) or by the first day of school.** If participating in athletics, this will include needing a valid, signed KHSAA physical uploaded in Final Forms before participating in any athletic activities.

If you do not have a FinalForms account, please create one account at: <https://notredameacademy-ky.finalforms.com> and follow the prompts to create the parent account, begin your daughter's account and sign your forms. *Your daughter's NDA gmail should be used when setting up her account.* Once the parent/guardian creates the account, the student will be prompted in her NDA email to submit her forms. Please note: if you have already turned in your daughter's immunization record, you do not need to upload separately. School personnel will upload for you.

If you already have an account for a returning student:

Login to your account and click MY STUDENTS to get started. Make sure you are updating information for the 23-24 school year.

FUN LESSON

MEDIEVAL MANUSCRIPTS



Last year, the Latin 3 and 4 dual credit students did a unit on medieval Latin manuscripts. After studying numerous virtual copies of real Latin manuscripts of literary texts from the Vatican online manuscript collection, the students used calligraphy markers and ancient-looking brown card-stock to create and decorate their own Latin manuscripts of the author's poems they had been reading, Catullus. This project was one of the students' favorite things they did that year and their manuscripts turned out beautifully. It gave the students valuable insight into how ancient literature was once preserved and the care, artistry, and time that went into it.



This year, the dual credit students followed up that unit with a field trip to the UC Classics library back in the fall, where they got to see and flip through some real life Latin manuscripts and get a tour of UC's 'scriptorium' where the manuscripts are kept, in addition to their rare book collection.



As yet even further follow up to that, a couple of months ago, NDA alumna Marlene Steele (who also took Latin as a student at NDA) spent a class with the Latin 4 dual credit students teaching them about calligraphy, sharing with them about her decades worth of experience as a professional calligrapher, designer of greeting card lettering and messages, and court room artist in the tristate area. Armed with a tool box full of supplies, she even modeled for the students how to write letters in different scripts and allowed them to try their hand with professional-level bottles of ink and an oblique wooden calligraphy pen.

The students enjoyed the chance to see modern-day use of fancy scripts and writing still in action, and the care, skill, and time that goes into it -- not dissimilar to how monks used to craft carefully scripted and adorned manuscripts during the Middle Age which preserved our literary texts. Marlene's visit was a fun lead in to spring break, valuable insight into an on-going interest for the dual credit students, and a refreshing chance to do some art in Latin class!



SCHOLARLY WRITINGS

LATIN CLASSES GO "OLD SCHOOL"

Latin Classes recently took a stab at going old school with their manuscript studies and attempted to write with jars of ink and feathers. Mrs. Barnes's parents sent pelican feathers that they collected from the beach and Mrs. Barnes brought in a jar of "feather pen ink" from Amazon to get her students started on this fun project. They cut the tip from some of the feathers and to their surprise it worked! To the left you can see Kira Kent looking all scholarly with the jar of ink and feather. Although it may not be the most efficient manner of writing, what a wonderful and full circle lesson for our Latin students!

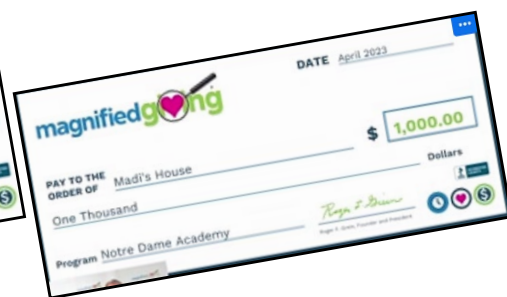
MAGNIFIED GIVING

DEVELOPING FUTURE PHILANTHROPISTS



Ms. Hilbert and Mrs. Middendorf's Personal Finance classes teamed up with Magnified Giving to educate our students about philanthropy, local non-profit organizations, and about getting involved through donating of time and grants. Magnified Giving provided two \$1000 grants and two \$500 grants that our classes could donate to any of the verified non-profit organizations through Magnified Giving.

Our students researched local non-profits, contacted the organizations, and built a presentation showing their peers what the organization has to offer and why our grants should go to them. At the end of the presentations, the students voted on who received the grants. There was a Zoom call where we presented the organizations with the checks. This process opens the eyes of our students to all the social causes and needs in our community and how we can make an impact.



ANCIENT ARTIFACTS

POMPEII: LIFE FROM THE ASHES

Recently all of Ms. Barnes's Latin classes got to learn about Pompeii, the ancient city preserved by the eruption of Mt. Vesuvius in 79 AD, from a UC doctoral student in Classics, Michelle Lessard, who visited with her presentation "Pompeii: Life from the Ashes," as part of the University of Cincinnati Classics Departments Community Outreach Program. Michelle taught the students more about Pompeii, how the eruption occurred, and what archaeologists are able to learn about the Romans from their excavations at Pompeii. Michelle brought a collection of ancient artifacts excavated at Pompeii by the UC archeological team over the years, including pieces of pottery, miniature oil lamps, a little perfume jar, and parts of a sewing loom, for students to pass around and touch - an experience not typically possible with artifacts more than 2,000 years old!

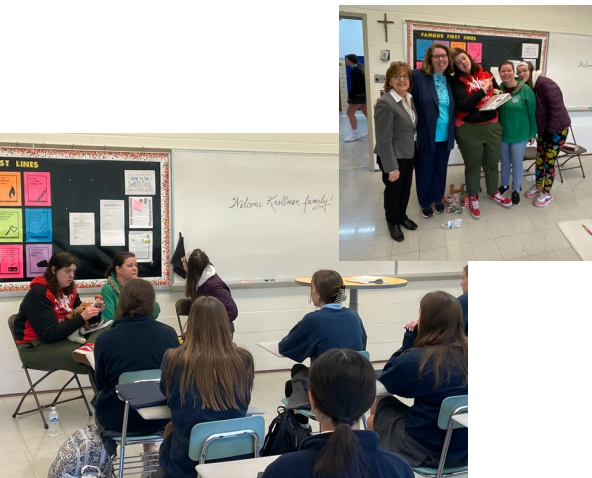

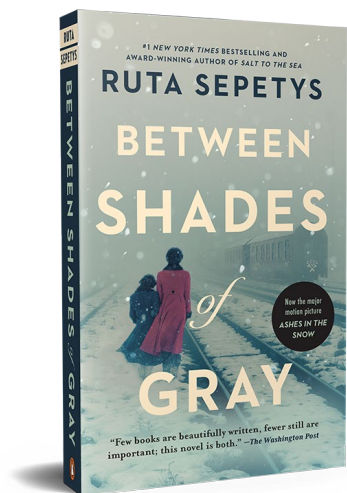

HEART HEALTHY

NDA HOSTS HEART SCREENING FOR STUDENTS

NDA will be hosting a heart screening through MCore on May 12 here at school. MCore's onsite screenings are provided at the highest level outside of the hospital with pediatric cardiac sonographers doing all the imaging and those are all read by pediatric cardiologists.
