I am grateful to our students, parents, faculty and staff for all they have done to make the 2021-22 school year a success. As a school community we committed ourselves to academic excellence and achieved a great deal of meaningful learning. We also dedicated ourselves to *Living the Gospel with a Spirit of Compassion, Hope and Joy* and we learned to *mind the gap*. I am very proud of the way our students made an effort this year to recognize where there is need and figure out ways in which they could help others. Finally, we set a goal to provide as much normalcy as possible for our students this school year while continuing to keep our community safe and together we accomplished that objective.

It not only helps keep our building in excellent condition, it also gives our students some ownership and responsibility in maintaining our school building which is a great life lesson.

Although there is much to celebrate at NDA, after the tragic events that took place yesterday in Uvalde, Texas, I would be remiss if I did not ask you for your continued prayers for an end to gun violence in our country. I ask that you join me in placing your heavy hearts and troubled minds in God's capable and loving hands praying for all of the innocent victims and implore God's divine help for our nation at this time. I encourage you to pray with your daughters asking God to turn our sadness into compassion, our tiredness into advocacy and our fear and paralysis into action. In God's name we pray for an end to gun violence in our country.

It is clear to me and I hope to each of you, that at NDA, we are part of a tradition larger than any one of us, a strong academic tradition of empowering young women to make a difference in the world. Thank you for partnering with us. I look forward to seeing our students in August and I wish you and your family a blessed and safe summer.

GOOD LUCK NDA WISHES THE CLASS OF 2022 WELL



TEACHING EXCELLENCE AT ALL LEVELS OF LEARNING CONGRATULATIONS DR. WOMBLE-ERICSON

On May 19, 2022, Dr. Jenifer Womble-Ericson successfully defended her doctoral dissertation entitled: "The Preparedness and Sustainability of 9th through 12th Grade General Education Teachers to Provide an Inclusive Classroom". Dr. Womble-Ericson earned her Ph.D. in Special Education Leadership from Concordia University Chicago. She hopes her research will influence and impact college pre-service training and education programs, K-12 in-service training and education programs, and general educators worldwide in providing and sustaining inclusive classrooms.



Dr. Womble-Ericson currently holds certifications in teaching English, Communications, Mathematics, English as a Second Language, and Exceptional Children. She has received spe-

cialized training as a diplomate with the American Academy of Special Education Professionals (AASEP), which has allowed her the opportunity to become a Board Certified Inclusive Education Specialist and Board Certified in Special Education. Dr. Womble-Ericson also serves on the National Association of Special Education Teachers (NASET) Advisory Council for Board Certifications and Professional Developments. In addition, she is a member of the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development (ASCD) and Council for Exceptional Children (CEC). Dr. Womble-Ericson also holds the distinction of being a member of the Omega Gamma Chi Honor Society for Special Education Teachers.

The highlight of Dr. Womble-Ericson's career has been revitalizing and facilitating the Academic Enhancement Program at Notre Dame Academy. She feels that "Notre Dame Academy provides all learners an educational experience that gives the students the foundation to become empowered, innovative, and inspired women".
