

### **Dear Parents.**

In order to ensure that our NDA community is well prepared for the first day of school this Tuesday, we thought it would be a good idea to share a special "Back to School" edition of the Panda Press Weekly today. Below you will find important information regarding uniform expectations, the student bulletin on Padlet and an explanation of our theme for this school year. I also wanted to share some information regarding a community improvement project that will affect NDA.

You have more than likely seen stories in the news regarding the Brent Spence Corridor improvement project over the last several years. The project includes constructing a critical companion bridge to the existing Brent Spence Bridge, improving traffic flow on the existing bridge, and constructing improvements to the interstate network throughout an eight-mile corridor from Dixie Highway in Kentucky to the Western Hills Viaduct in Ohio. As you can imagine, the bi-state project will affect property adjacent to the improvement project and I wanted to make you aware that it does impact Notre Dame Academy.

To put it in perspective, the project would require approximately one-third of an acre of our 25-acre property to accommodate the expansion of the corridor and would create an easement on our property as well. While the property that is impacted by the project does not include our school building or any of our athletic facilities, the increased traffic volume is a concern.

The Brent Spence Corridor improvement project is nationally significant and we understand the positive impact it will have on our region however, our responsibility is student learning and the safety of our school community. We therefore must look critically at this project and focus on how it could affect Notre Dame Academy.

Unfortunately we do not have central air conditioning throughout our entire school building and we currently use window units to cool our classrooms during warmer months. Being next to the expressway already causes sound issues for us at times and additional lanes on I-75/I-71 and the removal of a significant amount of vegetation on the south side of our property will certainly exacerbate that problem. Moving forward we are exploring our options as to how we can best mitigate the additional noise ensuring that our classrooms continue to have an atmosphere conducive to learning.

I will continue to provide you with updates to this project as the information becomes available. In the meantime, please know that we will continue to address this situation with student learning and the safety of our community at the forefront. Please feel free to reach out to me with any questions you may have about this.

### UNIFORMS EXPECTATIONS FOR 2022-2023

Approved Uniform pieces are listed below as stated in our Student/Parent Handbook:

Notre Dame Academy has a school uniform that consists of:

- a gray uniform skirt or uniform slacks (the skirt or pants must fit properly, be zipped and buttoned, hemmed appropriately and free of stains, rips, and/or holes). Students are required to obtain a new skirt or pants if it no longer zips, has tears, holes, or stains. Please note: Skirt should extend below student's fingertips when arms are fully extended at one's side.
- a white or light blue banded Notre Dame Academy polo shirt
- solid white, gray, black or navy blue socks
- appropriate shoes that have a back to them
- name tag/lanyard

Optional items that may be purchased and worn with the uniform include:

- a navy blue Notre Dame Academy pullover sweater
- a navy blue Notre Dame Academy cardigan sweater
- a navy blue Notre Dame sweater vest new item!
- a navy blue Notre Dame Academy sweatshirt (available for purchase through Schoolbelles and NDA's Bambootique)

- a navy blue blazer with NDA's emblem for special occasions such as Mass, award ceremonies, etc.
- gray, black, or navy blue leggings
- black dress slacks for designated events

## UPDATED DISMISSAL PROCEDURE

In preparation for the new school year, parking pass sales are now open for seniors and juniors. We will continue the staggered dismissal (implemented fall 2021) as well as traffic light support from Park Hills Police Department. Seniors (and their carpools) will be the first group to dismiss at 2:59 p.m., juniors (and their carpools) at 3:03 p.m. and sophomores and freshmen at 3:06 p.m.

This year, we have created grade level zones in the parking lot. This means student drivers will only be allowed to purchase a parking spot in their grade level's assigned zone. See diagram below.
