

WEEKLY UPDATE

COVID-19

As of today, Wednesday, September 1, we have had 0 new reported cases of members of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week. We have 1 additional member of our community who is currently in quarantine due to a reported exposure to COVID-19.

FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE

COVID-19 SCHOOL QUESTIONS

The following procedures were provided by the Diocese of Covington and can be found in NDA's Pandas Return to Campus Plan - Appendix B, Infection Procedures:

Q1. What are the symptoms of COVID-19? The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) has identified a wide-range of symptoms that can be mild to severe and symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with the following symptoms may have COVID-19: fever (above 100.4°F), chills, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle/body aches, headache, loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea and a new, uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing. Q2. What should a parent do if a child has illness symptoms? If your child shows illness symptoms that could be COVID-19, you should contact your doctor. Your doctor may ask that your child participate in a COVID-19 test. You must alert your school's main office and do not send your child to school. If the symptoms occur during the school day, your child will be sent to the office and you will be contacted to pick your child up from school. Your child may return to school when he/she has been symptom and fever free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication or your child's doctor has provided an alternative diagnosis.

Q3. What should I do if my child tests positive for COVID-19? You must contact your child's school immediately to report the positive case. You will need to provide details to the school principal to assist with contact tracing. This may include, but not be limited to: the date symptoms began, close contacts your child had with others, siblings (their school/grade levels), other activities, etc. This information will be used to determine if there were any close contacts in the school community. You should work with your child's primary care physician for treatment. Your child may not return to school for 10 days from the date symptoms began or the date of the positive test (if asymptomatic).

Q4. Will the school communicate positive student cases? Yes. Schools will continue to inform parents when their child is deemed a close contact to a positive case, if there is a positive case in a classroom, and will also keep the entire school community informed of case activity



HANDBOOK HIGHLIGHT

UNIFORM SKIRTS

All students at Notre Dame Academy are required to wear a school uniform, which emphasizes a traditional dress code. As stated on page 22 of the NDA Student/Parent Handbook,

By choosing to be a student at Notre Dame Academy, this code becomes the student's responsibility, and it is her responsibility to know the spirit of NDA's dress code and to be in compliance with that dress code while on school property. The cleanliness, length and neatness of the uniform skirt and uniform top reflect this pride.

An important part of the school uniform at Notre Dame Academy is the gray uniform skirt. When wearing the gray skirt, students are representing NDA. Therefore, as stated in the NDA Student/Parent Handbook:

The skirt must fit properly, be zipped and buttoned, hemmed appropriately and free of stains, rips, and/or holes...It may not be rolled at the waist and may be no more than three inches above the knee.

Students, PLEASE check the length of your uniform skirt and make sure that it is at least below your fingertips when your arms are fully extended.

Failure to comply with the uniform regulations will result in a uniform warning. Three uniform warnings will result in a detention. Students who continue to violate the uniform policy will face additional disciplinary action.

DRUG FREE CLUBS OF AMERICA

Adolescents are more susceptible than adults to becoming addicted. Those who initiate smoking or drug use before age 15 - are 5 times more likely to develop addictions to substances than those who wait until after age 21.
