LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL ◀

Blessings friends,

Today was SUPER WEDNESDAY at NDA. This morning our freshmen and sophomores took the College Equipped Readiness Test (CERT) while our juniors took the ACT. Our seniors spent the day taking part in their Senior Mission Retreat at St. Joseph Heights.

Following the standardized testing, freshmen, sophomores and juniors enjoyed a break with lunch and some well-deserved rec time. These three grade levels then attended an Active Threat training presentation entitled "Citizen Response to an Active Threat" given by Officer Chris Schutte from Lakeside Park. This was a follow up to the faculty and staff training held in August and the freshmen basic training in the fall. The presentation included a review of A.L.I.C.E. and identified our rally point which has changed to VonLehman this year versus CCH and St. Agnes as in the past. We also explained to the students that in the case that they were evacuated to this rally point, parents would not be picking them up there but rather at a reunification point to be named at that time. As always, our goal is to provide a safe learning environment at NDA where all students can feel secure and be productive in their studies.

Our College Planning meetings have all taken place and we now move on to registration of classes for the 2019-20 school year. Students can now go online to view recommended courses and register for electives for next year. All students have received an email explaining how to register and links for the process. You should have also received an email explaining that the course request window for entering your daughter's requests for the 2019-2020 year within PowerSchool is now open. Ms. Burgei and Mrs. Monohan will be in the cafeteria this week and next to help students with any questions they may have about schedules. 
CCH SPAGHETTI DINNER & FINE ARTS FESTIVAL ◀


Congratulations to the Aqua Pandas!
