After many months and a lot of research, we are excited to announce our decision to adopt **Canvas** as our new LMS learning management system.



The decision was heavily influenced by:

- **Integration:** it compliments Powerschool and Google Apps beautifully
- **Ease of use:** manages all NDA courses in one portal
- **Multimedia:** almost all file types can be uploaded, integrated, and delivered
World Language workflow robustly supported
- **iPad Friendly:** Canvas works very well with mobile devices especially in a 1:1 iPad environment
- **Course Building:** It provides instructors the opportunity to build any kind of course
Keeps all files and uploaded data in a repository
- **Collaboration:** Provides an excellent format to build sharing, collaborative communities online with your faculty peers and also outside our domain with educators around the world


Notre Damian Day






WCPO STUDENT OF THE WEEK ◀


