GUADALUPE MASS ◀



Applications for the Governor's School for the Arts (GSA) are DUE December 31, 2013.

GSA strongly encourages students to apply online, though your method of application will in no way impact acceptance into GSA. Click here to download an application, if you prefer to fill out a paper copy. If you have not already reviewed Audition Guidelines for the art form(s) for which you are applying, please do so before completing this application.

Please review the entire application before starting. You will not be able to save the application or edit it once it has been submitted - be prepared to complete the application in one sitting. It is suggested that you use an external program such as Microsoft Word to write answers to the two open-ended questions so you can save your answers and then copy and paste your responses in the provided fields. There is a \$10.00 application fee for one art form and a \$ 15.00 fee for two art forms. Free and reduced lunch applicants have the opportunity to opt out of the application fee. Payment options are located at the end of the form.



Opening Friday, December 13, will be a new show at the Carnegie in Covington KY. Along with many other talented professional artists, the work of Senior Rachel Birrer will be featured in the show that opens this weekend, and will be on display until February 14. To give you an idea of what you will see in Rachel's work: ([from the description found on The Carnegie's website](#))

Rachel Birrer's work is primarily focused upon the different aspects of the horse racing industry. By capturing suspended moments of energy and tension her work communicates the dynamic expressions involved in racing. In order to emphasize her processes, oftentimes Rachel will not use the traditional painting tools, but rather she will use an instrument that is connected with the subject of the work. Her go to 'paintbrush' is a riding crop dipped in paint and repeatedly struck against the canvas or paper.


