In order to be eligible for Financial Assistance and the NDA Work/Study Program one must follow a two step process:

- 1. The family must apply online for the FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment by April 1, 2014. The application cost is \$30 per family and can be paid online after completing the application.
- 2. Families who are eligible for FACTS money must also apply for a school job by April 15, 2014. A job application form can be downloaded from NDA's website or a copy can be found at the school office. Jobs are assigned during the summer and families will be notified about their acceptance in the program toward the end of the vacation period.

Bass Fishing








NDA STUDENTS ACCEPTED INTO CHALLENGING HONORS BUSINESS PROGRAM
